NOTE FROM OUR PASTOR



These last two weeks have been difficult for our nation as mother nature unleashed her devastating power over the people of Texas and Florida and beyond. The US bishops put it well, "With lives and livelihoods still at risk in Texas, Florida, the Virgin Islands and throughout the Caribbean, we pray for the safety and care of human life in the wake of two catastrophic hurricanes. The massive scale of the dual disasters and the effect it has on communities, families and individuals cannot be fully comprehended or adequately addressed in the immediate aftermath of the storms.



At this time of initial recovery, we mourn the loss of life, homes and other property, and the harm to the natural environment. We pray for all those affected and in need of assistance. We also pray for the safety of, and in thanksgiving for, the first responders who are risking their lives at this very moment in care of their neighbors, especially those who are elderly, sick, homeless, or otherwise already in need of special assistance."

It is in moments like this we see the true character of our nation and its people. The outpouring of assistance has been amazing. Regardless of creed, color or ethnic background people are helping one another and this parish is among them. You have already been so generous and continue to be so generous. Thank you for heartfelt compassion and care for others.

In the months ahead, there will be much more needed and we will be there. The bishops encourage us to respond generously with prayers, financial support, and volunteering of time and talents in support of those in need. Many of you have asked me if we will take a mission trip to the affected areas. We are already working with *Next Step Ministries* (our partners for our annual Texas Mission trip) to evaluate how best to help in Texas. As we explore options for a possible mission trip to either Texas or Florida or both, I ask you to prayerfully consider if you would like to volunteer for such a trip; would you be willing to be part of a team to organize such a trip. We already have our Texas mission trip scheduled for February and we are working with them to how best use that time there. Please let Mike Ferrero (mferrero@dsj.org), Penny Warne (pwarne@dsj.org) or me (bmcguire@dsg.org) know if you are interested and able to travel to Texas or Florida for any special mission trips. It will not be immediate, so there is plenty of time for discernment. Please consider where the Lord is calling us to minister.

LIVING THE LITURGY

Catechetical Sunday

This weekend we will celebrate Catechetical Sunday on September 17. The 2017 theme is "Living as Missionary Disciples." Catechetical Sunday is a wonderful opportunity to reflect on the role that each person plays, by virtue of Baptism, in handing on the faith and being a witness to the Gospel. The mission of the Church is to evangelize. To evangelize means to "spread the Good News." The heart of that message is to develop an encounter and relationship with Jesus Christ. From that encounter one becomes a member of the Body of Christ, which is the Church. Jesus's command is to share this message with the entire world. It is directed at everyone; not just the religious.

For most people the challenge is how to pass on the message of Jesus to their children. Most parents will go to great lengths to give their children the best possible opportunities. They want them to grow up and develop their abilities and interests as best they are able. To get the best possible education, children are sent to Catholic schools and participate in faith formation activities. There are many wonderful programs that explain the faith and help children develop a relationship with Jesus. As wonderful as some of these programs are, Catechesis is not done just in school or ends when the children graduate. Catechesis is a lifelong effort of forming people into being witnesses for Christ.

Formal education is just one of the ways that we learn about our faith. Another way is to attend and participate in the weekly celebration of Mass. In a liturgical year, we hear the entire story of the Gospel. We experience the sacramental symbols, ritual prayers and gestures of the liturgy. Every year the entire mystery of Christ, from his birth through his death, Resurrection, Ascension, and sending of the Spirit, is proclaimed and is celebrated. It is at Mass that the priest, in the person of Christ, breaks open the Word of God that was just proclaimed in the Liturgy of the Word and explains how it is relevant to the daily lives of the people. It is in the celebration of the Liturgy that we develop an encounter and relationship with Jesus Christ.

The liturgy has been called "the privileged place for catechizing the people of God". Together with catechetical education, the liturgy provides all of us an opportunity to experience and learn about the mystery of Christ, to fully express our faith and to pass it to our children.



PASTORAL CARE

Coping with Chronic Pain



One out of three people suffers from some form of chronic pain - arthritis, headaches, back pain, cancer, or countless other diagnosable or undiagnosable conditions which persist long after we expect the discomfort to go away. The key to living with and managing chronic pain is to manage your pain instead of letting your pain control you.

- Pursue competent medical treatment. Early intervention can often prevent chronic pain. Listen carefully, ask questions and implement their suggestions. If recommended, investigate pain-control techniques such as relaxation therapy, guided imagery, or meditation. You can learn these skills, with practice, from a qualified professional.
- Trust your own experience of pain: All pain is real, whether or not physicians can find a clinical reason for it. It is your body. Trust your perception. Do not add emotional pain to your physical pain. Pain is a highly subjective experience which is why medical teams ask patients to rate their pain 1-10. Consider joining a support group for pain sufferers to help give you validity to your experience, vent feelings and keep perspective.
- Make positive changes in your lifestyle: If you have been told by multiple physicians that your pain cannot be remedied, work towards acceptance and channel your energy into living productively with your condition. Rest when needed. Communicate with your loved ones. Pursue activities that bring you pleasure. Learn something new. Staying occupied helps to distract, at least temporarily, from pain.

We echo the sentiments of the Bishops of California and the United States in expressing our disappointment with the decision to rescind DACA (Deferred Action for Childhood Arrivals). We call upon Congress to pass laws that protect these young people, many for whom the United States is the only place they have ever known.

We also ask Congress to enact comprehensive immigration reform, to fix our broken system and, in so doing, to place the unification of families as a priority.

Working with Catholic Charities, the Diocese of San Jose will continue to offer outreach, support and encouragement to all who are affected by policies and laws that touch so many of our people.

I conclude by quoting today's statement of the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops: "As people of faith, we say to DACA youth - regardless of your immigration status, you are children of God and welcome in the Catholic Church. The Catholic Church supports you and will advocate for you."


