#### NOTE FROM OUR PASTOR



Last weekend at all Masses, we had alumni from Holy Spirit School give a 2-minute talk about their experience of elementary school and encouraging families to come and visit the school this weekend for their open house. I was so impressed by the quality of these young men and women. They have become such incredibly positive and good people. I know every one of them personally and regularly see how

they give back to their community at the parish and beyond. They are simply wonderful human beings and their families ought to be so proud of them. We at Holy Spirit Parish are certainly proud of who they have become.

While I have always known how important Catholic Elementary school education is and how impactful it can be, it was completely another thing to hear it from these young men and women. It really makes a huge difference. I also appreciate the huge sacrifice many parish families make to have their children attend elementary school here at Holy Spirit. I know I say this regularly but it is worth repeating. It is my desire that every family in the parish who has elementary aged children be given the opportunity to send their children to our school. As a result, we raise significant financial-aid dollars so every family can send their children here.

I ask every family to come and visit the school this weekend and become familiar with our great ministry there. We have an incredibly dedicated faculty and staff. Over the last few years they have worked extremely hard with the Drexel School System and have enabled



their students to perform at the top 8% of the nation in Math and top 15% in English Language Arts. Those are impressive numbers and we are one of the top performing schools in the whole Diocese. Please pass this information around your friends and neighbors. We really want to fill every single seat with children from our community.

Last weekend I also preached about the Annual Diocesan Appeal. Every year we take some time to recognize the work of the Central Offices of the Diocese called the Chancery and how important it is for us to support their work with our financial contribution. Since I work 50% of time at the parish and 50% of my time as Vicar General and with the bishop at the Chancery, I know firsthand how our resources are used. I can say with the greatest of confidence that our monies are well-spent and well-stewarded. Like I said in the homily last week, most of the work we do at the Chancery is not visible to the average parishioner. All our work is essential for the whole Church from one week to the next. This hidden work allows us to benefit from collective use of resources that otherwise would be expensive and difficult to acquire. Even more so, it allows for parishes with less resources serving in neighborhoods of need to be able to serve with the same quality service of every parish. This is so important for us a church because we are Catholic Church and not Congregationalists running individual fiefdoms.

This is our opportunity to support the Bishop in his outreach to every person across the whole diocese. Please consider and pray about how you will support the ADA. Every family ought to give a little. Thank you again for your incredible generosity throughout the year.

#### LIVING THE LITURGY



#### **Blessings**

Throughout our local community here at Holy Spirit, and certainly among the greater Catholic Church community, you hear phrases like, "God Bless You!" or "What a Blessing!" or "We're very blessed," on a regular basis. The terms, "Bless" "Blessed," or "Blessing, are often used, but

seldom broken down and defined with clarity. The word "Blessing" has a number of definitions or uses in the Catholic Church. The word is used, mainly in a liturgical context, to consecrate items, people, or places to the Lord through a liturgical act or rite. The word and its variations are also used in multiple contexts in the scripture. For example, in the context of praise to God ("I will bless the Lord at all times, His praise shall always be in my mouth" (Ps 34:2)), in a statement of good fortune ("Blessed are all who fear the LORD, and who walk in his ways. What your hands provide you will enjoy; you will be blessed and prosper." (Ps 128:1-2)), or as a dedication of a place or person for a sacred purpose ("[Jesus] led [the disciples] out as far as Bethany, raised his hands, and blessed them. As he blessed them he parted ways from them and was taken up to heaven" (Lk 24:50-51)).

In every sense of the word, it is necessary to acknowledge the blessing that we have received in the form of our Christmas Liturgy. This year was perhaps the busiest Christmas weekend we've had in the recent history of our parish community (11 masses in two days!), and the amount of work our parish community put in to make the weekend function makes us truly blessed.

Thanks go out to the Liturgy Preparation Committee which provides guidance and insight to the preparation process for each liturgy, as well as the entire Liturgy Ministerial team which carries out the liturgical ministries. That team is composed of the art and environment teams, music ministers, altar linen team, altar servers, bread bakers, Eucharistic ministers, lectors, Mass coordinators and ushers. A special mention goes out to the art and environment team and all those who came together to decorate the church and gym. The music ministers and all the different choirs were especially joyful in bringing everyone together in song. Many talented people created the lovely nativity scene in the courtyard and the setting for the children's Christmas pageant. Additionally, the liturgical prayer and social ministries teams provided support so everything could run smoothly. To all of you, thank you so much. As a parish we are truly grateful and truly blessed for you all.

A blessing, in the plainest sense, is a gift from God. There are so many gifts from God in this community for which we can be grateful. We continue to give thanks to God for the gift of this community, and are excited to continue to celebrate in giving God praise as one community of blessing.

#### **Saturday Lunch Ministry**

Please consider joining us in an exciting way to serve others. We meet in the Parish Hall at 10:30 a.m. to make sandwiches and pack lunches, then drive to the St. James Park area of downtown San Jose.

The sandwiches are distributed to

everyone in the park. When everyone has been served, part of the group follows the light rail tracks into the center of the city and distributes sandwiches as they walk. The part of the group who remains in the park **cleans up litter**.

We invite ten families to join us each month. We ask for a one to one ratio of adults to students as parents need to be with their child especially during the distribution in St. James Park. Student participation is limited to sixth grade and older. A donation of \$10 is asked from each family to cover the cost of food and supplies.

St. Thomas Aquinas

#### Feastday: January 28th

Born in a castle, Thomas was the son of a wealthy count who sent him to study with Benedictine monks when he was five years old. His teachers were surprised at the progress he made, for he surpassed all his fellow pupils in learning as well as in the practice of virtue. Thomas was a quiet boy that enjoyed studying. He studied the philosophy of Plato and Aristotle at the University of Paris when he was only fourteen.

After a few years of study, Thomas secretly joined the Dominican order. His wealthy family was not pleased by his vow of poverty, and sent his two brothers to force him to come home. Thomas was held in the castle for one year as his family tried to keep him from joining the Dominican Order. Then, the Pope called Thomas to Rome to talk with him and commanded Thomas' Mother and brothers not to stand in the way of his vocation.

Thomas then returned to his studies, living in Italy, Germany and in Paris. He remained in the Dominican order. Upon graduation, Thomas was ordained a priest and taught theology-the study of religion. During this time, he began to publish his writings. Thomas composed most of his works in his head and then dictated them to secretaries, often to three or four secretaries at once! His greatest work, the Summa Theologica, is the foundation of modern Catholic doctrine.

In 1273, Thomas experienced a powerful mystical vision. After the vision, he never wrote again, explaining that all he had written was like straw compared to what he had seen in his vision. He passed away three months later. Thomas was canonized in 1323. He was one of the greatest teachers of the Church, he was declared a Doctor of the Church in 1567.


