Sacred Heart Reverse Collection

Next Sunday is our annual reverse collection for Sacred Heart. You will be asked to take a slip from the second collection basket instead of putting money in. These slips will ask you to donate products that Sacred Heart distributes every day to their many customers. We will be collecting these items at Holy Spirit from **February 24th through March 4th** and we will donate them to Sacred Heart.

The Reverse Collection can be a Lenten family experience. During Lent, we are examining ourselves and our hearts so that we can follow Christ more closely. We have been blessed by God with so much and it is our Christian responsibility to care for others. We ask that you prayerfully consider participating in the Reverse Collection.

Sacred Heart provides many daily essentials to their customers. Items that are in high demand include pop-top cans, disposable diapers, infant formula, and adult tube socks.



As we all know, there are thousands of homeless men, women and children in Santa Clara County, and Sacred Heart offers them non-cooking bags of food that contain pop-top cans and produce, as well as bag lunches. Many homeless walk constantly to keep moving and avoid loitering, and Sacred Heart provides clean, dry socks to make their days easier.

Sacred Heart also helps families with young children. Diapers and infant formula are expensive, and customers often cannot afford to purchase the diapers and formula that they need for their children.

Please remember these needs when you are shopping this week, and thank you for caring for those in our community.

NOTE FROM OUR PASTOR

This week, on Wednesday, we celebrated a liturgy for the close of the Village House shelter at Holy Spirit for the 15 women experiencing homelessness. We hosted for 5 weeks and things went well overall. They now go to Willow Glen United Methodist Church, one of our early partners in this endeavor. Pastor Rebecca was on hand to receive the ladies and to assure them of the love waiting for them at their Church. This whole process has been a wonderful blessing to the parish again this year.

I want to give a public thank you to all our volunteers and especially the leadership team led by Mike Ferrero. He took a lead in the whole operation along with his many teams of people who help him, especially Bob Fields and Christine Burroughs who were on hand for every major step. They have done a fantastic job. Please hold the women in your prayers each day. They continue to need our support spiritually too.

Now we transition this week to our Lenten journey starting on Ash Wednesday, February 14th. Valentine's Day is an unusual day to start our Lenten observances and many people have asked that they skip the regular Lenten practices for Ash Wednesday. I would ask us to engage in Ash Wednesday as we would always do. Valentine's Day is a worthy celebration in itself for love is always a worthy celebration. I submit that Ash Wednesday has the higher importance and we can use the day to highlight our loved one's place in our lives.

The concept behind lent has always been three separate and equally important aspects: **prayer, fasting and almsgiving**. All three of these are to help us prepare for the celebration of Easter. It is our journey of renewal of our commitment to discipleship. If you would prefer to see it in sports terms: it is our commitment to get in shape spiritually again. We get back to basics of our spiritual journey.



I do not think I need to say anything more about prayer, as I am constantly encouraging you to pray more each day, other than to add that **now is the time to commit to 30 minutes of prayer daily**. Fasting is something we rarely talk about and it is directly connected to almsgiving. The purpose of **fasting is to "sacrifice" something for the sake of others**. To deliberately deprive ourselves, to consciously choose to do without something but for a purpose. That purpose is to open our eyes to those who do not have as much as we have.

I encourage you to think about what you will sacrifice for the sake of others. What will you give up or do that will help you focus your discipleship on others more in need than us. Please also help your children to "give up something" for the sake of others. Prayer, fasting and almsgiving all go together. Let's start with Ash Wednesday and give up our candy that day and think of all those who are without love. Think of those who are stuck in human trafficking and have nobody to love them and recognize their human dignity. Yes, candy is easy to give up if we focus on others and think of their lack of love. Then we promise to love our loved ones even more.



How will you spend these forty days of Lent?



Ash Wednesday

This coming Wednesday, we as a Church will be celebrating an important day marking the beginning of the holy season of Lent. While the world around us will be bustling with beautiful flowers and colorfully wrapped chocolates for Valentine's Day, we, as a community, will be taking an opportunity to look at our lives here on earth and to remember the importance of keeping our eyes on eternal life.

Ash Wednesday comes along once a year and is the first day of Lent -- the season before Easter. It is a truly unique celebration, often remembered as the day when people are signed with ashes on their foreheads. The ashes that mark our foreheads on Wednesday have a deeper meaning than letting our friends know that we are church goers, though. The ashes remind us of our mortality, and that our God is constantly inviting us into communion with Him because He is gracious and merciful.

On Wednesday, the Distribution of Ashes will replace the Penitential Rite, the part of mass where we acknowledge our sins and ask God for forgiveness. During the Distribution of Ashes, the phrases "Repent and believe in the Gospel" or "Remember that you are dust, and to dust you shall return" will be said to each person receiving ashes. These words are not to downplay the existence of human life nor to accuse church-goers of being overly sinful. These phrases bring perspective the discipline of Lent: Prayer, Fasting, and Almsgiving.

During Lent, we remember the Love of God and to return to Him with our whole hearts as a reminder of our baptismal promises to be followers of Christ. Pope Francis wrote about Lent this year, saying that "Lent summons and enables us to come back to the Lord wholeheartedly and in every aspect of life." This makes Ash Wednesday all the more important, especially on Valentine's Day, to remember that the material things of this world are fleeting, and that true joy comes in the consolation of eternal life.



Ash Wednesday Questions for Kids

Q: Hey, your forehead's dirty. What's that on your forehead?

A: Ashes...they're from church.



Q: Why did your church put dirt on your forehead?

A: It's not dirt; they're ashes. Today's Ash Wednesday, the first day of Lent. Catholics wear ashes to show that we want to change to get ready for Easter.

Q: Are they supposed to be in a shape or something? Just looks like a smudge to me.

A: It's supposed to be in the shape of a cross – like the one that Jesus died on.

Q: So you think you're something special because you're wearing ashes on your forehead?

A: No, just the opposite. It shows that without God, this is all we are – ashes. It's a way of admitting how much we need God.

Q: So how're you gonna change...gonna become all holy on us?

A: Just trying to become what God wants me to be...a good person.

Q: I hear you guys give up stuff for Lent too. What for?

A: Giving up stuff – like snacks or watching TV or swearing – is kinda like exercise – it's hard work but it makes us stronger.

Q: So you can't have any fun for how long?

A: I can still have fun, I'm just gonna be doing some stuff a little differently for 40 days...that's how long until Easter.

Q: Then you can go back to being your old self?

A: No, that's the point, hopefully I'll be an even better version of myself!

There will be **no 3sixty youth night this weekend**. 3sixty resumes Sunday, February 18th for a social night. All high school youth are invited to attend.


Edge Middle School Ministry




