Pastor's Note

Many people over the last few weeks have asked me "What is the best response to someone who shares that they have been sexually abused?" It is a great question because responding to a trauma is something that most of us are not familiar with and can be hard to figure out. I hope this article will help with a response.

The model response has four simple steps. 1) Listen, 2) Acknowledge pain, 3) Share sorrow 4) Offer of prayer and support. A useful way to remember the steps is "LASO".

Listening attentively to their story is incredibly important. At the end of their sharing simply acknowledge you heard them by mentioning some small detail of what they said. Then add that you are sorry to hear of their suffering and pain. And finally offer to pray for them and offer any other support they might need.

In such moments, some don't know what to say and say nothing for fear of saying the wrong thing. The challenge with that reaction is it can be incredibly painful for the abused person who has taken the courage to share their wound of the past. It is not always painful but it can be. The potential for additional hurt is directly proportional to the intimacy of the relationship. The closer you are as



friends, the higher the unspoken expectation is to respond with empathy.

Let me illustrate with an analogy. Think for a moment if the 14-year-old son of one of your closest friends was killed in an auto accident. Because of the suddenness of the accident, everyone is in shock, including you. When you next meet your friend, it would be very strange not to acknowledge the pain and suffering. If you had a lunch scheduled and you went through the whole lunch and never mentioned the death of his son, it would not be a surprise if that friend was profoundly hurt. We do not need to make the whole lunch about the death of their son as they may not want to talk about it. But if we simply follow the four steps of the model: LASO 1) Listen, 2) Acknowledge pain, 3) Share sorrow 4) Offer of prayer and support then lunch can continue or if the person is ready they can talk about it.



Think of concentric circles of intimacy shown here. The closer to the center, the closer the friendship and higher the expectation for response. We implicitly expect our close friends and family to respond with some words of empathy. If they remain silent, further hurt can ensue. The further outside, the expectation lessens and the chance of hurt is minimal.

Here is an interesting fact though. Someone on the outside can still bring healing with kind words because there is no expectation. Well-chosen words can heal at every level of intimacy. Let me share with you a text I got from a friend I have not seen in years.

Brendan, hi. I just listened to your last homily online. May the Lord be with you - my heart broke as you told your story, so full of grace, love and bravery. I stand by you, with you, sharing your burden any way I can. I'm not sure I have ever seen a more selfless act as I watched you speak the truth for all the world to hear. May the church follow you in honesty and transparency - it is the path forward. Let me know if I can help in any way. You are loved, admired, respected, and a shining light for us all.

All of us have the ability to heal others with some kind words. I encourage you to remember the four steps of a model response in your mind and heart and be ready to heal even a stranger's hurt.

LIVING THE LITURGY



Mass Coordinators: Service As a Sacrifice of Praise

During the Mass, there are many different moving parts that all need to work together to ensure a truly Spirit-filled worship experience. At the beginning of Mass alone, there are several things happening at the same time: The communion vessels

are prepared and placed in their spots on the credence table, the candles are lit, the books are bookmarked in the proper place for the readings and prayers of the day, the amount of bread and wine for communion are carefully measured in reference to the number of people attending Mass, and the ministers form a procession line to begin the Gathering Rite of the Mass. In order to navigate the preparation of so many moving parts throughout the liturgy, we at Holy Spirit Church entrust the coordination of our liturgies to a group of very experienced liturgical ministers called Mass Coordinators.

The Mass Coordinator Ministry here at Holy Spirit is a combination of several different liturgical ministries that are common in most parishes in the Catholic Church. The Mass Coordinator assists the presider in ensuring proper preparation and purification of communion vessels throughout the liturgy, prepares the liturgical books, sees to it that the appropriate liturgical actions are performed correctly and aids the presider with any other tasks that are needed throughout the liturgy.

In his letter to the Hebrews, St. Paul encourages the people, saying "Through him, then, let us continually offer God a sacrifice of praise... do not neglect to do good and to share what you have; God is pleased by sacrifices of that kind" (Hw 13:15a, 16). We, by virtue given to us at baptism, are called by God to share what we have with others as a sacrifice of praise. The Mass Coordinators, through the many tasks they fulfill and the support they give to the proceedings of the Mass, give a great deal to the worship of our God that we celebrate together here at Holy Spirit Parish. As a community, let us follow their example and give what gifts we can and present them to the Lord in worship.

Survival Sacks

Holy Spirit parishioners are continuing to volunteer to distribute Survival Sacks at Sacred Heart Community Center. We gather on the first and third Thursdays of the month to distribute Survival Sacks, organize supplies, make hygiene kits, and fill backpacks. Sacks are provided to those who are homeless and living on the streets of San Jose, usually about 50 on each distribution day.



We continue to receive support from various Catholic High Schools (Presentation, Mitty, and St. Francis) as well as from several local parishes. Also Starbucks on Monterey near Sacred Heart and Starbucks on Curtner near Old Almaden Road continue to provide coffee for our clients who are most appreciative of their support. Finally the American Association of University Women and the Sunnyvale Moose Lodge have recently made donations. We appreciate all of their support and hope you will thank them as well should you have contact with anyone from these organizations.

Our greatest need (as far as supplies for the program) is for men's underwear. If you would like to donate underwear to the Survival Sack Program, contact us via our e-mail listed below.

St. Vincent de Paul

This week, on September 27th, we celebrate St. Vincent de Paul's feast day. St. Vincent de Paul is the patron saint of charitable societies (catholic.org).

He became a priest in the year 1600 and spent his life preaching and doing missionary work, providing relief to the poor and imprisoned. He advocated for the reformation of seminaries in his time, aided in the establishment of hospitals, and cofounded the Daughters of Charity with St. Louise de Marillac in 1633.

In 1737, St. Vincent de Paul was canonized by Pope Clement XIII, 77 years after his passing.

The Daughters of Charity and Society of St. Vincent de Paul are highly active in the Diocese of San Jose, and dioceses around the world, serving those in need. Many Holy Spirit parishioners are involved in the local ministries of St. Vincent de Paul and the Daughters of Charity, setting wonderful examples for future generations.


Liturgies to Welcome Bishop Oscar Cantú
