Statement of Bishop Patrick J. McGrath

Diocese of San Jose

When I began plans to retire, and considered where I would live, I had wanted to remain in the Diocese of San

Jose. This has been my home for nearly 20 years. At first, I had hoped to live in a diocesan-owned house that is located on cemetery property, but necessary retrofitting proved to be too costly.

This made it necessary to look for another house. The Diocesan Finance Council and the College of Consultors approved the purchase of the home in the Willow Glen neighborhood of San Jose. I agreed with them that in economic terms the purchase of the home made sense in terms of financial return on investment. It was bought primarily with funds that had been designated for this sole purpose, funds that had accrued from the sale of Bishop DuMaine's condominium, when he was no longer able to live in it due to failing health.

However, I erred in judgment in the purchase of a 5-bedroom home for \$2.3 million. I failed to consider adequately the housing crisis in this valley and the struggles of so many families and communities in light of that crisis.

I have heard from many on this topic and I have decided that I will not move into this house. The Diocese will put it up for sale as soon as possible; if there is any profit to the Diocese from that sale, those funds will be donated to Charities Housing, a division of Catholic Charities of Santa Clara County.

I assume full responsibility for this decision and I believe that the sale of the house is the appropriate action. I thank those who have advised me.

When I retire, I now intend to live in a rectory at one of our parishes.

NOTE FROM OUR PASTOR

This has been a difficult week for the Catholic Church internationally, nationally and even more so for us locally with the front-page news of the purchase of a house for the bishop for his retirement. These are self-inflicted wounds and I am sorry they are causing so much pain for all of us.

Many of you have written to me expressing your disappointment, and even outrage, at the Bishop's decision to buy such a large house. As he said in his open letter of apology (printed on the front page), while it was a sound financial investment, it was an error in judgment for which he is profoundly sorry. I share his sorrow and ask you to please forgive his insensitivity. He is a good man who has served our local Church for over 20 years as a bishop and nearly 50 years as a priest. He had a lapse in judgement. It is heart-breaking to watch him in this moment of weakness. He is truly sorry for his oversight and will learn from this error in judgment even though his retirement is near. I remain by his side each day to help him handle this matter and will remain so even though it is personally painful for me too. I feel your pain and I want to acknowledge your hurt. It is very real. The current struggle in the Church is drowning me in sorrow.

On the national and international front, again it is a self-inflicted wound that the secular world is all-too-glad to seize upon. But remember it is "self-inflicted" and we must pray for our Church leaders to return to Jesus Christ as the way, the truth and the life. This sexual abuse is a devastation to many victims and re-traumatization for them. For many, those wounds were in the past and now have been brought to the surface again. Some of these are people who have already spoken out and others who have not yet found their voice. Some happened in the Church at the hands of clergy and others have been at the hands of family members. We need to pray for all victims that they find their voice and seek healing that they so desperately want and need. God will not abandon his Church. Christ will not abandon us. Please pray for victims and healing.

Most of you know from my last two weekends of homilies, this is very painful for me personally and it continues to be so. But I will remain with you and will remain with the Lord Jesus. It is his Church and I will not abandon him or his Church, especially not now in its time of need. I know that my homilies have distressed some of you but be assured we are in pain together and we will get through this together. Thank you for so many of you who have reached out to me and thank you for your personal notes. They mean a great deal to me. Thank you from the bottom of my heart. Please pray for Fr. Edgar and all your priests in this time of struggle. We need each other.



Finally, please pray for me as I travel to Santa Barbara to preside at a wedding of parishioner. I will not be able to attend any Masses this weekend but will be here next weekend. Thank you for your steadfast faith.

LIVING THE LITURGY



Charisms and Body of Christ

St. Paul writes in his letter to the Romans, "For as in one body we have many parts, and all the parts do not have the same function, so we, though many, are the body of Christ,

and individually parts of one another" (Rom 12:4-5). Perhaps one of the most beautiful aspects of a faith community is the different abilities, talents, and treasures that each individual member contributes for the good of the community and, moreover, for the greater glory of God.

While all the different ministries of the Catholic Church revolve around this concept of the individual members of the Body of Christ contributing their gifts, there are perhaps none more prevalent than the different skills presented in the Liturgy. Whether it is through music, speaking, personal encounter, baking bread, writing prayer intentions, or countless others, God gives us all a gift that is intended to be given back to God in worship.

These gifts that God gives us for worship are called Charisms; gifts of the Holy Spirit given to us by the Lord in an incredible abundance. There are many gifts given to humanity in this way; wisdom, knowledge, faith, healing, prophecy, discernment, tongues, interpretation of tongues, and many others. To describe these, St. Paul uses the Greek word meaning "gracious gift" or "favor." The Catechism of the Catholic Church goes on to say that, "Charisms are oriented toward sanctifying grace and are intended for the common good of the Church. They are at the service of charity which builds up the Church" (CCC 2003).

St. Paul, in his first letter to the Corinthians, writes, "There are different kinds of spiritual gifts but the same Spirit; there are different forms of service but the same Lord; there are different workings but the same God who produces all of them in everyone" (1 Cor 12:4-5). As we come together every week to worship at the Table of the Lord, our God is inviting each and every one of us to present ourselves and all we have to Him in thanksgiving and praise. Through Christ's sacrifice, we are all enabled to be Christ to the World, and are empowered by the Body of Christ we share during communion, and in the Word we encounter during the Mass. The question we're all called to ask is this: In what way can you let Christ work through your talents to bring glory to God in the Liturgy?






