NOTE FROM OUR PASTOR



I hope you had a great Thanksgiving holiday with family and friends. Last weekend, we entered the Advent season

and the beginning of a new Church year. It is a season to joyfully anticipate the Lord's coming. But we are also called to be part of the coming of Christ in the way we treat each other. St. John of the Cross said, "In the evening of our life, we will be judged not on how well we will have lived but how well we have loved." In that case we need to be watchful for opportunities to help others and to be the living message of Christ today.

This weekend we celebrate the Second Sunday of Advent. It is an opportunity for us to start anew in our spiritual lives. It is an opportunity to slow down and take all of life into our hearts and see where the Lord is calling us to serve.

I know that this season, many of you will connect and will volunteer at Sacred Heart Community Service and serve those in need there. Others of you will help raise and collect gifts for needy children with our Toy Program. Still more of you are getting ready to serve in our Village House shelter for women experiencing homelessness.

This weekend we launch our *Gifts of Opportunity* program for those in need in Nicaragua. We ask you to consider giving an alternative gift in lieu of a regular gift to a loved one. These gifts literally change the course of people's lives forever. John Bland was here thanking us and asking us to step up again this year. Thank you as always.

When we reach into our pockets or go online and give a little, we are not just helping someone in Nicaragua, we are changing the trajectory of their lives forever. We will lift them out of extreme poverty and the debilitating reality of *life on less than a \$1 a day*. When we give a little, we will change their lives a lot. They will survive better on \$4 a day but our hope and dream for them is to lift them out completely and get them on \$10 a day through these gifts of opportunity where they can pull themselves out of poverty permanently.

Come and join me in giving a life changing gift this Christmas.



How can I be prepared to be a messenger for the Kingdom?

Immaculate Conception

The Immaculate Conception of the Blessed Virgin Mary is the Patronal Feast day of the United States of America. Pope Francis says the Gospel story of the announcement of the Birth of Jesus helps us to understand what we are celebrating.

Through the Angel Gabriel's greeting, he addresses Mary with the word "kecharitomeno", which means "highly favored one", "having been favored one", "having been graced", "filled with grace", "created by grace", "full of grace" (Lk 1:28).

What does full of grace mean? Pope Francis says that Mary is filled with the presence of God. And if she is entirely inhabited by God, there is no room within her for sin. She is the one "evergreen oasis" of humanity, the only one uncontaminated, created immaculate so as to fully welcome, with her *fiat*, God who came into the world, i.e. God made flesh.

The Council of Trent promulgated a dogmatic decree that all men and women are born tainted by original sin caused by the fall of Adam and Eve at the beginning of time with the exception of Mary, Jesus' mother. The Church Fathers believed that the Annunciation story indicates that Mary was bestowed with the divine fullness of grace, a heavenly gift conferred by and poured from the power of God and was never subject to the curse of original sin. Additionally, it would not be fitting for Mary, carrying the Son of God in your womb, to be stained by sin.

This dogma, *Ineffabilis Deus*, declared that the most Blessed Virgin Mary, in the first instance of her conception, by a singular grace and privilege granted by the Almighty God, in view of the merits of Christ Jesus, the Savior of the human race, was preserved free from all stain of original sin, all fair and perfect. That is what we celebrate on the Feast of the Immaculate Conception.

The next session for the year 2 group will be on Wednesday, **December 18th** at 6:30pm in the Church.



Why do

Catholics start their prayers with the sign of the Cross?

This practice tends to be particularly uncomfortable and challenging for Protestants who are joining Catholics for worship (or joining the Catholic Church). As Catholics, there are a couple of reasons that we begin all our prayer "In the name of the Father, and the Son and the Holy Spirit" while making the sign of the Cross on our body. First of all, we are calling on the whole Being of God—the Trinity. We are reminded that when we pray, even if we single out one of the members of the Trinity (like praying specifically to Jesus or the Father), we are always engaging a whole God. All Three are always present, all three make up the One God. The other part of this is the act of making the sign of the cross on ourselves. We do this as a reminder that while we are addressing the Trinity in our prayer, we come to God in humility; understanding that we are only saved by the sacrifice that Jesus made for us on the Cross. Our whole relationship with God begins and ends with this selfless act of Jesus, and we are called to imitate the love He has for us, by making sacrifices for others. We communicate with God in the hope of becoming more like God; which means that we have to be as selfless as we can be—like Jesus.

Caring For Yourself During the Holidays

Despite the many joys of the Season, the holidays

can add a heavy load of duty and responsibility which cause feelings of stress to soar. Caregivers, parents, and those carrying grief in their hearts are especially affected by this added stress. So, how do you limit the triggers of stress or at the very least, cope with the stress that is sometimes unavoidable?

- ◊ Make a to-do list/organize, then eliminate any unnecessary commitments
- ◊ Call on your support network
- ◊ Learn to say "No, thank you."
- ◊ Don't aim for perfection
- ◊ Laugh – it's good for your body and your soul!
- ◊ Maintain your health/diet/exercise
- ◊ Spend devoted time with immediate family (this replenishes and alleviates guilt)
- ◊ Remember to breathe – take deep slow breaths to calm mind and body
- ◊ Journal and pray

"Self-care is not selfish." Throughout the holiday season, and year-round, remember to be good to yourself. Caregivers work very hard and deserve quality time to meet their own emotional needs. Only by replenishing our own reserves can we continue to give to others.
