Every dollar received over our goal comes back to Holy Spirit Parish and will be directed to our parish efforts to grow our ministries. We hope that we can count on your support.



NOTE FROM OUR PASTOR



We are now just two weeks into hosting the *Village House* shelter for the 15 women experiencing homelessness and things have been going quite well overall. Our clients seem more at risk and medically fragile this year than previous years. We have had several Emergency Room runs to local hospitals. One of the women has remained in the hospital for several nights. Thanks especially to the medical volunteers for looking after the women at night. They have been a wonderful blessing to the team.

Everything is going well from the meals by countless families to transportation to the placemats from the school children along with their personal notes of prayer to the ladies. The blankets and comforters are being washed by volunteers each week and that really gives the ladies a sense of dignity. Intake volunteers are doing a great job of being present to the ladies needs as they vary each night.

Most of the women spend the day at Episcopal Church of Almaden (ECA) where they are pampered every day! For any volunteers who want to spend more time with the women,

Bonnie McPherson is always looking for more volunteers over there! We welcome Alicia Morales, our volunteer case worker, as she started last week and the women have responded well to her presence. She splits her time between Holy Spirit and ECA; MWF 4pm-9pm and TH 2-6pm.



We still need help for the overnight volunteers especially the late night shift and in particular we need one woman to be with them each night.

Bob Fields is also looking for help with set-up and take-down of the cots. They are a bit more cumbersome to move this year.

If you have not already volunteered for some role, I ask you to please consider doing so. It is a wonderful opportunity to experience the Village House and understand that these women are just like your mother, sister or daughter. There is little difference that separates us: a bad event happens to them, a bad decision, a downturn in health and suddenly they find themselves on the streets. We are doing great work by welcoming them into our Church and I want you to experience that for yourself.

A huge thank you to all our volunteers and especially the leadership team led by Mike Ferrero. He takes a lead in the whole operation along with his teams of people who help him especially Bob Fields who is on hand for every major step. They have done a fantastic job. Please help in any way you can.

Finally, I ask you to hold the women in your prayers each day. They need our support spiritually too.

The Roman Rite

The Catholic Church is incredibly unique in the way we celebrate together. We call each formal celebration a rite, which is simply a solemn celebration or act. Within the church, we have many solemn celebrations, such as the Rite of Matrimony, the Rite of Baptism, and the Rite of Christian Funerals. But perhaps the most important rite within the Roman Catholic Church is the Roman Rite.

The Roman Rite is the celebration we partake in every Sunday, the proper Eucharistic celebration of the Roman Catholic Church. The Roman Rite has been the main celebration of the Catholic Church for the majority of the Church's existence. It became the main form of celebration after the First Council of Nicea in the 4th Century AD. Around the time of this council, there were several rites that had formed, some stemming from as far back as the teaching of the Apostles.

There are several rites within the Catholic Church besides the Roman Rite that are still recognized by the Church. The Catechism of the Catholic Church says:

"The Liturgical traditions, or rites presently in use in the church are the Latin (principally the Roman Rite, but also the rites of certain local churches, such as the Ambrosian rite of Milan, or those of certain religious orders) and the Byzantine, Alexandrian or Coptic, Syriac, Armenian, Marionite, and Chaldean rites." (CCC 1203)

While the Roman Rite is the celebration most commonly used, the Church recognizes several ways to celebrate. In the Vatican II document, *Sacrosanctum Concilium*, the Council says that "in faithful obedience to tradition, the Sacred Council declares that (the Roman Catholic Church) holds all lawfully recognized rites to be of equal right and dignity, and that (the Church) wishes to preserve them in the future and to foster them in every way."

There are many ways to worship in the Catholic church. The Church considers the worship of individual places and traditions to be of equal importance. When we come together to worship every Sunday, we recognize the differences of the cultures and traditions of our world, and celebrate in the mystery of Christ's sacrifice of the altar as the body of Christ.

Saturday Lunch Ministry



Please consider joining us in an exciting way to serve others. We meet in the Parish Hall at 10:30 a.m. to make sandwiches and then pack the lunches, which include sandwiches, fruit, cookie, and a drink. After the lunches have been made, we drive to the St. James Park area of downtown San Jose. The **sandwiches are distributed** to

everyone in the park. When everyone has been served, part of the group follows the light rail tracks into the center of the city and distributes sandwiches as they walk. The part of the group who remains in the park **cleans up litter**. Even litter that isn't part of the Holy Spirit lunches will be cleared away.

We invite ten families to join us each month. We ask for a one to one ratio of adults to students as parents need to be with their child especially during the distribution in St. James Park. Student participation is limited to sixth grade and older. A donation of \$10 is asked from each family to cover the cost of food and supplies.

2018 Nicaragua Mission Trips

The start of registration for the summer trips is quickly approaching. Registration for the Youth and Family weeks will open on **Monday, Feb 12th at 6 pm**. The registration date for the Adult Trip has not yet been determined. Please note that the adult trip is now scheduled for **Saturday, October 13-20** instead of October 20-27 as was announced in last week's bulletin. The registration period for this year is compressed as compared to previous years and will close at noon on March 9th. Cost for the Youth and Family trips is \$1150. This includes airfare, room and board, and an administration fee. At the time of registration, a non-refundable deposit of \$450 will be required. Final payment will be due no later than April 6th. There will be informational meetings for each of the summer trips on **Sunday, January 21st** at 1 pm (Youth Trip) and at 2 pm (Family Trip) in the church. FAITH FORMATION

How do you pass on your Catholic faith to your children? Archbishop J. Michael Miller of Vancouver offers some practical tips to help parents evangelize and catechize their children.

1. Be present to your children. "In a word: Stay home, eat together at least once a day, tuck your little ones in at night, and do things together as a family."

2. Be joyful witnesses to the Gospel. "It's true, the saying -- even if it's hackneyed -- that faith is caught and not taught."

3. Pray with your children. "It can be as simple as grace before meals, an Our Father and a Hail Mary and a Glory Be -- or any two out of the three -- before the children go to bed. But start with something."

4. Go to Sunday Mass together. "Every activity on Sunday should be planned around Mass together. This communicates to young people pretty vital lessons about life: that life is not just about work, it's not just about sports; it's also about praise and worship of God."

5. Read the Bible together as a family. "I suggest that you begin with a Gospel -- the Gospel of Mark, the Gospel of Luke -- and just do it a little bit at a time, a few verses."

6. Sacramentalize your home. "Children are fascinated by rosaries, crucifixes, holy water, palms, candles, ashes, pictures and statues of the saints. These all point to the great mystery of the Incarnation."





Training to become a long term care ombudsman will begin again soon. In Santa Clara County, the program is managed by Catholic Charities.
