



NOTE FROM OUR PASTOR

Many of you commented on the beauty of last weekend's liturgies but asked, "Why we are doing what we are doing?" It is important to know why. **The bishop has designated the month of October as a month of repentance at every parish in the Diocese** for the sins of the abuser-priests and the failure of the bishops' leadership. As such, we **simplified our church environment** similar to Lent and the presiders wear purple vestments, the color of repentance. We are trying to **emphasize humility as presiders** since it was priests who sinned in the past.

While Fr. Edgar or I were not offenders in any of the previous abuse, as priests we represent the priests of the past who have sinned. As difficult as it is for me personally to represent those priests, it will be my role to do so and ask the Church, the people of God, and God himself for forgiveness of their sins and the sins of the Bishops with regard to their failure to protect the children and assist the parents when abuse was identified.

To that end, we will not wear a chasuble vestment but instead lay the vestment over the presider's chair. We will wear only the stole for Mass and sit in a chair beside the presider's chair as a symbol of humility. We will not sing an opening song but use the sound bowl as we do in Lent. The presider will prostrate fully before the altar asking for forgiveness for the sins of our brother-priests and our bishops. We will have special prayers throughout the liturgy for forgiveness from victims, for healing for our Church and for courage for our bishops to take the right actions to restore trust in our Church leadership.



Fr. Edgar will lead an **adoration prayer service every Friday, from 7:00-8:00 p.m.** on behalf of the priests and bishops of the past asking God for forgiveness. All parishioners are invited to join him in those prayers. The priests will also fast one day each week in repentance.

I ask you to join us in prayer in a special way for healing for all victims that they hopefully will find their voices and come forward.

I want to emphasize that the people of God did not do anything wrong but are now saddled with great shame of the Church. Fr. Edgar and I are profoundly sorry for the pain this is causing you and your family. We share that shame and ask forgiveness for the sins of the past.

Many of you continue to ask me if you can join the last **Listening Session with Bishop PJ McGrath**. Absolutely, if you wish to do so. I will be there on **Wednesday, October 17th, 3:00 p.m.** at Santa Teresa Parish in San Jose.

Now more than ever, we as the people of God must act to ensure it never happens again. At the doors of the Church there will be **cards addressed to the US Conference of Bishops and our local bishops** urging them to take tangible action to ensure that the children and vulnerable adults are safe and protected in our Church and to lead our Church boldly to a new level of transparency and truth. I ask you to consider taking these cards and signing them. You can then bring them back to the parish and we will make sure they are delivered. Let's reform the Church.



How do I find time to serve
and who do I serve?

Formula for Spoken Prayer

Process is an important aspect of communication. In order to teach someone how to make a delicious meal, there is typically a kind of recipe to follow. In order for the construction workers to build a house correctly, the architect must leave careful instructions in his blueprints. Even furniture from IKEA has directions on it!



Just like a master chef, an architect, or the designers at IKEA, Jesus left us careful instructions on how to pray together in Luke's Gospel:

He was praying in a certain place, and when he had finished, one of his disciples said to him, "Lord, teach us to pray just as John taught his disciples." He said to them, "When you pray, say:

Father, hallowed be your name, your kingdom come. Give us each day our daily bread and forgive us our sins for we ourselves forgive everyone in debt to us, and do not subject us to the final test" (Luke, 11:1-4).

In this passage, Jesus sets for us not only the prayer we pray by rote every Sunday (the Lord's Prayer or the "Our Father"), but he gives us a formula we use every time we pray together. It can be described in a simple rhyme: You, Who, Do, Through.

- You (Invocation): At the beginning of every prayer, we address to whom we are praying. ("Our Father, who art in heaven..." "All Mighty, ever-living God," "Holy Father," etc.)
- Who (Thanksgiving/Anamnesis): After we address God at the beginning of the prayer, we acknowledge the blessings we've received. ("...hallowed be thy name; thy kingdom come; thy will be done on earth as it is in heaven," "We praise you, we bless you, we adore you, we glorify you," etc.)
- Do (Petition/Intercessions): Once we've addressed God and acknowledge the blessings we receive, we ask God for further blessing or to bless others ("...give us this day our daily bread and forgive us our trespasses..." "Bless us, O Lord, and these thy gifts which we are about to receive," etc.).
- Through (Doxology): As Christians, we end a prayer with an acknowledgement of God in the the Doxology. This also lets us know when to respond with "Amen." (...Who live and reign forever and ever." "From thy bounty through Christ our Lord" "For the Kingdom, the Power and the Glory are yours now and forever," "One God, forever and ever," etc.)

These four parts combine to create the vast majority of prayers we pray together as a community. Whether it is the prayer before meals, the Blessing of the Animals, or the Lord's Prayer, we all follow the pattern of You, Who, Do, Through. This week, try to find the many prayers we pray during the Mass that follow this pattern.
