



When battered by life's storms, or immersed in a dense fog of suffering and uncertainty, we may feel alone and unequipped to handle the circumstances. Yet with words that echo through thousands of years into the corners of our hearts, the Lord says to us, "Do not fear: I am with you" (Isaiah 41:10).

He speaks these words not as one who merely observes our pain, but as one who experienced immense suffering.

And the very wounds that bear witness to his suffering indicate the essence of our identity and worth: we are loved by God.

Reflecting on the healed wounds of the Risen Christ, we see that even our most difficult trials can be the place where God manifests his victory. He makes all things beautiful. He makes all things new.

He is *always* with us. Jesus promised this when he gave the disciples the same mission he gives to each of us: Go.

Go be my hands and feet to a world enslaved by fear. Go to the woman who is unexpectedly pregnant and fears the future. Go to your friend who fears reprisal at work because he takes a stand for the protection of human life. Go to your aging parent in failing health who fears being a burden. And go to others, too, for their support.

We don't need to have everything figured out. We can simply follow the guidance of Our Blessed Mother, the first disciple: "Do whatever he tells you" (John 2:5).

Walk with each other. Do not be afraid to embrace God's gift of life. Whatever storms or trials we face, we are not alone. He is with us.

NOTE FROM OUR PASTOR



One Hundred years ago this month, Mary, Our Lady Mother of God, appeared and spoke to three children for the last time in a small town in Portugal called Fatima. She had appeared to them on the 13th of each month from May to October 1917. Her message was very simple: to pray every day, to make a little sacrifice for God and to pray for peace in the world. The three children, Lusia, Jacinta, and Francisco, were not initially believed by the adults in the town. In fact, the local police authorities imprisoned them so that they could not return to be with Mary as she had instructed them. Each of these three children were made saints this very year when Pope Francis went to Fatima in May 2017.

The church celebrates Mary, mother of God, each year during the month of May. The month of October is dedicated specifically to the Holy Rosary. In October, it is especially important to celebrate Our Lady with special




devotion to the Rosary. I ask you please to pray the Rosary each day this month and specifically to pray for peace in these troubled times.

Many people ask me about how to pray the Rosary as are many different ways. I find the following way very helpful for me so I share it with you. When I celebrate each of the decades and the mysteries, I try to meditate on the mystery as I say each Hail Mary. I do so by pausing after "Jesus" in the first part of the Hail Mary and I say a phrase related to the mystery. For example, with the sorrowful mystery of the crucifixion, I would say "Jesus, the crucified one, holy Mary mother of God..." Then I would continue this way for each one of the decades of the mystery.

I hope this helps you when praying the Rosary and to focus your prayer more on Jesus.

We will hold a **Prayer Service with Adoration on Friday, October 13th at 7pm** to commemorate this special day.

dipped the wand into the water blest, With much eagerness and joy were we all possessed; He moved through the crowd and there rose such a swell, As drop by drop the holy water fell; On Toby, on Coco, on Leila and Milly, On Daisy, on Bella on Jasper and Lily; On Enzo and Gino and all of the rest, One by one, we all got blest; A final blessing to us did he bestow, And when he

was done, it was time for us to go. He sprang toward the church and passing the hall, He yelled: Now dash away, dash away, dash away all! And we heard him exclaim, as he walked out of sight, "Happy Blessings to all, and to all a good night!"

We are celebrating the feast of St Francis of Assisi, Sunday, October 8th at 1pm to make it real easy; We are blessing all animals large and small, Everyone is welcome on the courtyard by the hall; If you miss the event it will be such a shame, For it's all your fault, no one else is to blame.

FAITH FORMATION

Saints Who and How?

In our Faith formation classes we teach a Saint of the week and parents have come with questions about Saints and how to talk to their children about Saints, so I found a really easy explanation of what is a Saint and how a Saint becomes a Saint.

The process for being declared a saint is ancient, traditional, and often mysterious. Evidence must be presented to persuade Church officials that the person in question in fact lived a virtuous life, had faith, and had the support and help of God. The Church also looks at miracles as evidence that God is working through that person.

Stages on the road to sainthood

Usually, the process of recognizing a saint starts no earlier than five years after a person's death. Usually, the potential saint's pastor presents the case to the bishop. Specific stages are met on the path to being declared a saint:

Servant of God: As soon as the person is accepted for consideration, he/she is called a Servant of God.

Venerable: After the Vatican Congregation for the Causes of Saints determines that the servant of God lived a life of heroic virtue, she is granted the title of venerable. Heroic virtue doesn't mean a person was perfect or sinless, but that she worked aggressively to improve herself spiritually and never gave up trying to be better and grow in holiness.

Students Raise Funds for Relief Efforts

Every morning at assembly, our students offer prayers for those in need. As they prayed for victims of all the recent natural disasters, they were motivated to put their faith into action. Students were encouraged to donate \$1 to aid in the Red Cross' disaster relief efforts. Their generosity resulted in a \$1219 donation.



FAITH FORMATION CONT'D

Blessed: After the Church establishes one miracle, the venerable person's cause is presented to the pope to see whether he deems her worthy of being called blessed. This step is called beatification and is the next-to-last step.

Saint: Another miracle and the blessed person's cause is presented to the pope again for his judgment. If he determines that the evidence is clear and that contrary reports aren't credible, he may initiate the canonization procedure. If all goes well, the candidate is publicly recognized as a saint.

Scripture Study: Israel's Story Part I

Thursday mornings, 8:15 to 10:00 am, Parish Hall Library beginning Thursday, October 12th until November 16th.

Our Old Testament is divided into sections based on traditional understandings of the type of literature they represent. Anyone reading through the Old Testament in the order the books appear might find themselves challenged to appreciate their scope and context. How do these writings contribute to Israel's self understanding? How do they reflect the setting and period of history from which they arose? This study explores Old Testament history, theology, and stories from the creation accounts of Genesis to the fall of the Northern Kingdom (722 B.C.) and its prophets. Its goal is to provide participants with a good overview of how ancient Israel understood its relationship to God, its history, its beliefs, and its hopes, as documented in the Old Testament.




