The Catholic Communication Campaign (CCC) is an opportunity to help people across the United States and around the world connect with Christ. For example, the island of Samar in the Philippines is home to nearly two million people, about 90% of whom are Catholic. Many live in remote villages outside the reach of television and the Internet. Instead, radio is a critical source of information. The Catholic Church has provided the people of Samar with spiritual programming through a dedicated radio station for 20 years.

But in 2013, Typhoon Haiyan hit the island. It destroyed the entire radio station. The community has been unable to fund a new station, leaving hundreds of thousands without access to spiritual messages



Jesus calls us to be people of forgiveness-how do I live that out?



We continue to read from John's Gospel chapter 14 and 15 where Jesus explains to his disciples that he will be leaving soon but that he will send us his Spirit. He commands them and us to love

another. He reminds us to "always remain in him" and he will remain with us. One of the



metaphors he uses is the vine and the branches. He says, "Remain in me, as I remain in you...I am the vine, you are the branches. Whoever remains in me and I in him will bear much fruit, because without me you can do nothing." That all sounds so simple and I think for the most part we try to remain part of him and pray.

But then comes the hard part where he talks about "pruning." He says, "He takes away every branch in me that does not bear fruit, and everyone that does he prunes so that it bears more fruit." I have always thought about those wines that get pruned. If they could talk, would the vine not scream about having any of its limbs being pruned. "Hey! Vine grower! What are you doing cutting that branch off? That branch is bearing some fruit! Why are you cutting part of me away? I thought you wanted fruit from me, and that branch has fruit!" The vine does not understand that the more branches it has the less fruit it will bear. The vine does not comprehend that the vine grower does not want just fruit but wants "more fruit."

In the same way, when the Lord takes some things away from us, we might protest. "Hey God! What are you doing taking some things away from me? I was doing good things with what you have given me, I was bearing some fruit! Why are you cutting part of me away? I thought you wanted fruit from me and that part of me has fruit!" We do not understand that the eternal vine grower, God, wants more fruit from us and the only way to get more fruit, is to shed some things. It never feels good to shed things from our lives, but the Lord wants more fruit.

We all struggle with trying to do too many things. Most of us are overcommitted. Our lives are endlessly filled with action items and places to be and things to do. Most, if not all, of those things are good things which makes it very difficult to let them go. But more branches do not produce more fruit. The same way more good things are not necessarily better.

Maybe we need to shed some of the many "good" things we are doing so we can produce even more fruit. I know that recently the Lord is calling me to do just that; to do less and produce more fruit. It is hard to decide what to let go in order to be more balanced but that's where prayer helps. We let the Lord decide what we are to let go off. It is a process of discernment, a process of listening to the Lord in our hearts.

I hope you can take Memorial Day weekend and rest a while and look at the many things you are committed to. And see if the Lord is asking you to do less and produce more!

LIVING THE LITURGY



The Sign of the Cross

One of the most basic Christian gesture in prayer is the sign of the Cross. As Pope Benedict says, "It is a visible and public "YES" to Him who suffered for humanity; to Him who in the body has made God's love visible, even to

the utmost; to the God who reigns not by destruction but by humility of suffering and love, which is stronger than all the power of the world and wiser than all the calculating intelligence to men (The Spirit of the Liturgy – Ratzinger, p. 177)."

Indeed, we recognize that a person is a Catholic whenever they make the sign of the Cross. It is very integral to the Catholic Faith. It is not only a sign or symbol but it is our own public declaration of our belief in Christ crucified who suffered and bore the pain to save us all. It is through the cross that salvation came to humanity. It is through the cross that death and sin were overcome by the power of God. It also signifies our belief in the Triune God, God the Father, God the Son, and God the Holy Spirit who from the beginning was with us and will be until the end of time. It is also a remembrance of our own baptism. The cross took away our original sin, renewed us, and we were reborn to a new life. It is also a symbol for protection. It will hopefully shield us from every evil and temptation. Finally, it is a symbol of Hope, the hope for the Resurrected Christ to come again. The sign of the Cross is the summary of the whole essence of Christianity. Behold the Cross of Jesus Christ, our Lord and Savior.

Saturday Lunch Ministry

We meet in the Parish Hall at 10:30 a.m. to make sandwiches and then pack the lunches, which include sandwiches, fruit, cookie, and a drink. After the lunches have been made, we drive to the St. James Park area of downtown San Jose.

The lunches are distributed to



everyone in the park. When everyone has been served, part of the group follows the light rail tracks into the center of the city and distributes sandwiches as they walk. The part of the group who remains in the park cleans up litter. Even litter that isn't part of the Holy Spirit lunches will be cleared away. We invite ten families to join us on June 1st, the first Saturday of the month.

We ask for a one to one ratio of adults to students as parents need to be with their child especially during the distribution in St. James Park. Student participation is limited to sixth grade and older. A donation of \$10 is asked from each family to cover the cost of food and supplies. PASTORAL CARE



Stroke Awareness, Part 2

Sometimes other symptoms appear with a stroke, separately, in combination with F.A.S.T. signs (see last week's bulletin). Knowing the signs and symptoms of a stroke is the first step to ensuring medical help is received immediately. For each minute a stroke goes untreated and blood flow to the brain continues to be blocked, a person loses about 1.9 million neurons. This could mean that a person's speech, movement, memory, and so much more can be affected. Learn as many stroke symptoms as possible so you can recognize stroke FAST and save a life!

Stroke symptoms include:

- SUDDEN numbress or weakness of face, arm or leg, especially on one side of the body
- SUDDEN confusion, trouble speaking, or understanding
- SUDDEN trouble seeing in one or both eye
- SUDDEN trouble walking, dizziness, loss of balance or coordination
- **SUDDEN** severe headache with no known cause

Call 9-1-1 immediately if you observe any of these symptoms. Note the time of the first symptom. This information is important and can affect treatment decisions. To find out more and help educate others, visit www.stroke.org.
