How do I feed Jesus' sheep, our community?

For the next seven weeks until Pentecost Sunday, we celebrate the early Church's life in the Spirit. At daily Mass, we will hear scriptures from the Acts of the Apostles and the different gospels about how Christ appeared to the disciples and met them where they were and encouraged them to believe in him. It is an exciting time to read about how courageous and

bold these early disciples became after they experienced the Risen Lord. Their boldness and enthusiasm have always been a hallmark of true belief in Christ and given as a testimony to the risen Christ and the message of God in his love for humanity.

Theologian N.T. Wright notes in *Surprised by Hope*. "Jesus' resurrection is the beginning of God's new project not to snatch people away from earth to heaven but colonize earth with the life of Heaven. That, after all, is what the Lord's prayer is about." In other words, God wants us to be convinced about his love



for us here and now and not just when we get to heaven. Several times the Risen Jesus tells the disciples to go back to Galilee. That is a reminder to go back to where they first experienced him. It is a call to return to their first experiences of faith. It is a call to return to their first encounter with him. In going back to their first encounter they are reminded how powerful their first experience was.

We, too, are called go back to that first experience to remind ourselves of our first experience of faith. We are called to be enthused and be bold about our faith. For most of us, it is not complicated as we can just go back in our minds and remember those early days and try to re-live them again. So that is what we must do. For others to be convinced by our faith we must be willing to live it anew; to live it with a renewed enthusiasm and boldness. Could we try to do something extra to show our boldness? Maybe it is something as simple as being kinder and being gentler. The simple things matter a great deal. Maybe we could all show a little more joy in our life? I still find that the fastest way to joy is through gratitude. Let's be grateful for the many gifts of life we have and share our joy with others with gentleness and kindness. That may seem simple and it is, but it is also very hard to do every day.

In a special way, may we keep the families of those killed in Sri Lanka in our prayers. What a sad day that such innocent people were killed in terrorist attacks. I found myself praying also for those who did these things. May God forgive them, and may they be brought to justice. May we pray for peace for all people and may all religions be able to pray in peace.

Survival Sack Distribution

Holy Spirit parishioners are continuing to volunteer to distribute Survival Sacks at Sacred Heart Community Center. We gather on the **first and third Thursdays** of the month to distribute Survival Sacks, organize supplies, make hygiene kits, and



fill backpacks. Sacks are provided to those who are homeless and living on the streets of San Jose. We usually distribute 40 Sacks per day.

Survival Sacks will be distributed on May 2nd and 16th. The signup link can be found, starting April 29th on the parish website at holyspiritchurch.org/sacred-heart-community-service. Volunteers must be 16 or older. We meet at Sacred Heart at 8:45 a.m. and finish up around 10:45 a.m.

We have the privilege of looking for the face of Christ in each of our clients. If you are unable to volunteer, we would request that you say the following prayer for the homeless each day during your meditation time:

God of compassion, your love for humanity was revealed in Jesus whose earthly life began in a stable and ended in the pain and isolation of the cross. We hold before you those who are homeless. Draw near and comfort them in spirit and bless those who provide them with shelter, food, and friendship. We ask in Jesus' name. Amen.

Saturday Lunch Ministry

We meet in the Parish Hall at 10:30 a.m. to make sandwiches and then pack the lunches, which include sandwiches, fruit, cookie, and a drink.

After the lunches have been made, we drive to the St. James Park area of downtown San Jose. The lunches are distributed to everyone in the park.

When everyone has been served, part of the group follows the light rail tracks into the center of the city and distributes sandwiches as they walk. The part of the group who remains in the park cleans up litter. Even litter that isn't part of the Holy Spirit lunches will be cleared away.

We invite ten families to join us **on May 4th**, the first Saturday of the month. We ask for a one to one ratio of adults to students as parents need to be with their child especially during the distribution in St. James Park. Student participation is limited to sixth grade and older. A donation of \$10 is asked from each family to cover the cost of food and supplies.
