In so doing, we pledge to stand alongside these members of our human family, supporting them as the Gospel calls us to do.

Please consider these suggestions in your family's Lenten plan:

- Use your CRS Rice Bowl and Lenten Calendar daily to guide your prayer, fasting and almsgiving.
- Read the Stories of Hope and daily reflections to inspire your Lenten journey—and guide your Lenten almsgiving.
- Prepare simple, meatless meals on the Fridays of Lent to eat in solidarity with our brothers and sisters around the world.
- Visit **crsricebowl.org** to watch videos of the people and communities you support through your Lenten gifts to CRS Rice Bowl.

We will collect your CRS Rice Bowls at the end of Lent. Thank you for participating in CRS Rice Bowl with your family.




#### **Annual Diocesan Appeal**

Thank you for your continued support of the ADA and of our parish. To date, we have raised \$160,455 of our Diocesan goal of \$290,000 and our parish stretch goal of \$400,000. At this time, there have been 252 families from

our parish that contributed to the ADA. We are at 55% of our Diocesan goal and 40% of our parish goal.

Has there ever been a time that you" fell silent" in a prayer experience and profoundly felt God's presence?

# I have two friends who have a really bad sense of direction. They could drive out of the home garage, take a left turn and be immediately lost! Seriously! It is extraordinary. I try to never let them drive.

However, they both deal with it differently. One never admits he is lost and keeps driving. He takes a left turn, then right turn, then goes straight with great certitude but he is completely lost! Eventually I will ask where are we going? And he will say where and I'll say we passed that place twice already! My other friend will always admit he is lost and will take a U-turn and say, "I'll lost. I need to go back!" We will help him get his bearings and we all get back on track. My second friend is



easier to be with because there is no pretense as to who he is...and I love him for that humility!

I think Lent is about admitting that in our discipleship of life, we are lost and we need to take a U-turn. Fundamentally, we are all lost, we are all sinners and Lent is the time to admit it. We can all say, "I am lost. I need to take a U-turn." And turn back towards God. We call this "metanoia" and it literally means, "turn around."

On Ash Wednesday, when we put ashes on our forehead, we were proclaiming to the whole world that we are sinners and we are repenting and turning back to God. But we do it for the whole 40 days. The Church three ways to help us stay on task: **Prayer, fasting** and **almsgiving**. They are interconnected realities. When we **pray**, we are asking for insightful to see our sins, to see the errors of our ways. When we **fast**, we deliberately do without something we enjoy so we can be reminded how blessed we are and to think of those who go without the basics of life. Those two practices lead us to **give alms**, to serve others who are in need.

We do all this because we know that we can get distracted from leading a life of a good disciple. Even though we come to Church each week, we say our prayers and are a devote spouse, we still find ourselves losing our temper with our children or spouse. We may find ourselves caught in the bad habit of saying some wrong words to people regularly. Or maybe we find ourselves being lazy and selfish, and not willing to help others. We all have something different we are working on or ought to be working on.

For this Lent, may we promise to may a U-turn and admit "I am lost" and "I am a sinner." As a physical reminder of that sinfulness and lost state, we have pebbles at the back of Church. Please take one and keep it in a prominent place in your house or car. Put it on our desk at work or at home, put it in your purse or wallet, put it in your pocket or in your shoe! Put it somewhere you see it every day and remind yourself of your sins and of your promise of Lent to take a U-turn and turn back to God.

#### **Lenten Gospel Acclamation**

As we begin our journey into Lent, we make several changes to the way we celebrate our Eucharistic Liturgy-- Purple linens replace our green altar cloth, banners and vestments, we refrain from singing the Gloria, and we begin our celebrations with the tolling of a bell instead of a



Gathering Processional Hymn. Another of the most notable changes to our Liturgy is the way we acclaim the reading of the Gospel each week.

All other times of the year we sing the word, "Alleluia" as part of our Gospel Acclamation. This word comes from the Hebrew word meaning "Praise Yahweh." In our tradition, it is an acclamation of great joy that has been seen as the main form of praise of the choirs of angels of our God in heaven, and a reminder of the relationship between heaven and earth in our faith life.

Lent, however, is the time of year that we emphasize the coming kingdom, prioritizing in a special way our time in prayer, fasting and almsgiving. The season gives us signs of the coming of Jesus through the spiritual journey of the Old Testament prophets, and focuses on the coming of Christ to his passion o0 Good Friday, which leads ultimately to his resurrection on Easter Sunday.

To emphasize this preparation for the death and resurrection of Christ, we omit the Alleluia and wait patiently to sing alleluia again at the Easter Vigil on Holy Saturday before the Gospel is proclaimed. In its place, we sing a different acclamation all throughout Lent. The Graduale Romanum, the official Liturgy resource that contains sung prayer and chants that are prescribed for mass, offers several options that could replace the Alleluia. Here at Holy Spirit, we use what we consider to be the most common: Glory to You, Word of God, Lord Jesus Christ.

As we enter into Lent, we prepare to acknowledge our sin and prepare to witness the greatest sacrifice of our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ. When we sing the words, "Glory to You, Word of God, Lord Jesus Christ," let us allow for our faith to be deepened and for the spirit of Lent to make its way into our hearts.

### Visiting the elderly as a Lenten Act of Service, part 1



Visiting an elderly relative or friend at home or in a nursing home can be a meaningful activity for children, and adults during Lent. It can also be uncomfortable for anyone not used to visiting with senior citizens. Initially, it may seem that we have little in common. This is especially hard if either the visitor or the senior citizen is shy or quiet. Here are some easy ways to break the ice:

- Ask them about photos they have in their room or apartment. Who is it? Are they related?
- Show them photos of your own on your phone or tablet.
- Bring some cookies or another treat (if approved by their doctor).
- Bring a traditional board game; ask their favorite for the next visit.
- Sit outside if the weather permits.
- Take a short walk together
- Share a simple seasonal craft (or ask them to teach you their skill)

Using Lent as an incentive to step outside your comfort zone, make a plan to visit an elderly person once a week. You may discover that you enjoy it so much you'll want to continue well beyond Easter!

As most of us are aware, religious affiliation is on the decline, particularly among young adults. Santa Clara University professor Elizabeth Drescher has been exploring the spirituality of the unaffiliated--the so-called "Nones," who answer "none" when asked with what religion they identify--including young adults, and finds many opportunities for sustained conversation and connection among religious communities and practitioners and those who no longer see institutional religious communities as the center of their spiritual lives. And her students have keen insights on what pushes young adults away from churches and what might draw them into meaningful engagement, if not membership. Join Professor Drescher and a small group of young adults for a morning of insight, exploration and conversation on what the Nones can teach church communities about religion and spirituality today.
