LIVING THE LITURGY



Ushers- More than a Greeter

The Church calls us to be people of welcome and invitation, taking the words of Jesus to heart, when he says "Whoever receives you, receives me, and whoever receives me receives the One who sent me" (Matthew 10:40). As a community

blessed with many hands working together in the vineyard of the Lord, Holy Spirit has a ministry that is focused on welcoming the stranger and fostering the "fully conscious and active participation" in the liturgy that the Church calls us to. This ministry is our Usher Ministry.

Though many see the Ushers as a simple greeter, who waits at the doors to say hello to parishioners as they enter the Worship space on Sundays, the responsibility of the Usher goes much deeper than that, and is steeped in the long tradition of the Church.

Dating back to the third century, ushers were originally called Porters, whose jobs were to guard the proceedings of the Liturgy against disruptive intruders. Though their current job is quite the opposite, as the first to welcome people as they enter the Church, the intention is rather similar; engage the community for the furtherment of the Kingdom, and for the benefit of the proceeding of the Liturgy.

The usher's job also continues into the procedures of the Eucharistic celebration itself; ushers hold the responsibility of moving offertory baskets, communicating with members of the community who come in late, offering a warm presence to those who are immobile, and ensuring that the Communion Procession runs smoothly, allowing all to receive the Eucharist in Communion with one another in such a way that encourages full, active and intentional relationship with Jesus.

The Usher ministry has one very important requirement- a willingness to reach out in charity to individuals in the community. This loving engagement of the individual, the welcoming of the stranger, and the drawing-in of the outcast is an extremely crucial part of our Worship of God, and the Ushers joyfully enable us to be a complete Body of Christ in our celebration.

Saturday Lunch Ministry

Please consider joining us in an exciting way to serve others. We meet in the Parish Office at 10:30 a.m. to make sandwiches and pack lunches, which include sandwiches, fruit, cookie, and a drink. After the lunches have been made, we drive to the St. James Park

area of downtown San Jose. The sandwiches are distributed to everyone in the park. When everyone has been served, part of the group follows the light rail tracks into the center of the city and distributes sandwiches as they walk. The part of the group who remains in the park cleans up litter. Even litter that isn't part of the Holy Spirit lunches will be cleared away.

We invite ten families to join us every 1st Saturday of the month. We ask for a one to one ratio of adults to students as parents need to be with their child especially during the distribution in St. James Park. Student participation is limited to sixth grade and older. A donation of \$10 is asked from each family to cover the cost of food and supplies.

An Ombudsman is a trained and state-certified individual who investigates complaints and resolves problems for residents of long term care facilities. The Ombudsman visits nursing homes and assisted living facilities. Successful completion of training and certification by the State of California is required.

CLOW provides children with an opportunity to take a more active part in the celebration of their faith. At the end of the Introductory Rites, the children are led by our dedicated catechists to the classrooms in the Parish Hall. The catechists introduce the first reading and Gospel to the children in a text that they can understand, followed by questions to help them reflect upon the readings and deepen their understanding of God’s message. Supplemental activities related to the readings are often provided, such as word search or coloring activities. Catechists and children end their time with a prayer and return to the assembly during the Prayers of the Faithful.






