As a disciple of Jesus, how do I love others?

Recently I read an article written by David Brooks about the two mountains of life.

The first mountain is all about achievement and the attainment of goals for "self." Then we hit the proverbial "valley" experience when something happens to us or we just grow unfulfilled. Then comes the second mountain of life that enables us to move to contribution to the lives of "others" and the community. I love this metaphor because it speaks to me as a hiker but



also because I believe for us living in Silicon Valley, we are often consumed with climbing this first mountain of achievement and personal success. We can get so easily seduced into thinking that it is all there is in life. Most of us experience something in our lives that moves us to re-examine our life and values.

I know that happened to be me when I was just 27 years old living the dream life here in Silicon Valley as a newly minted engineer working in the IT industry in Silicon Valley. Yet I knew there was something more to my life than just climbing a mountain for myself. More to life than just making money and being successful as alluring as those were for me. I knew there was more to life that I felt called to. For me, I had to listen deep within my own heart because I felt the Lord was asking me to leave it all behind and come and follow him by becoming a priest. That was a radical move and one that needed much prayer and examination of my heart's desire. But ultimately it has taken me up a second mountain that was been amazing. It has been exciting, terrifying, beautiful, sad. All of those and more. It is an honor to hike this mountain with so many of you who have met on this mountain. It is one that we continue to hike and encourage others to join us on.

All of us are called to follow the Lord in our own way. It is our "vocation," our call from the Lord. Each one of us has a different path but the call is the same, to follow him in all we say and do. That is the call of the second mountain. It is call that we can hear when we are still on the first mountain or it is a call we inevitable hear in the dark valley between the mountains. But it still takes courage to choose and hike that second mountain. It is the mountain which gives meaning to our lives and it will only make sense when we get on it.

Music and Liturgy

"Awake, my soul! Awake, O harp and lyre! I will awake the dawn! I will give thanks to you, O Lord, among the peoples; I will sing praises to you among the nations. For your steadfast love is great to the heavens your faithfulness to the cloud" (Ps 57:8f).

We know for a fact that if we sing, we pray twice according to the Catechism of Catholic Church

(CCC) par. 1156. This quote is originally taken from St. Augustine's commentary on Ps 72:1, he said, "For he that sing praise, not only praise, but with gladness; he that sing praise, not only sing, but also love him of whom he sing, there is the speaking of one confessing: in singing, the affection of one loving."

It is truly inspiring and moving when we all sing as we celebrate the Liturgy. It is in singing that we deepen our faith and hope to the One who deserves our praises and thanksgiving in the sense of giving back to Him the beauty of His creation.

It is in singing that we give more of ourselves to the One who fills the earth with His glory and who is worthy of our praise (Ps 72:19). Furthermore in CCC par. 1157, "Music in the Liturgy adds to the beauty in the expression of prayer, has great effect in unifying the assembly through active participation, and creates a solemn atmosphere."

Indeed, just listening to the sweet voices, draws us intimately closer to the God who deserves all of our love.

May is Stroke Awareness Month

Fewer than half of 9-1-1 calls for stroke are made within one hour of symptom onset and fewer than half of callers correctly identify stroke as the reason for their call. The acronym FAST is an easy way to identify the most common symptoms of a stroke:

F – Face: Ask the person to smile. Does one side of the face droop?

A – Arms: Ask the person to raise both arms. Does one arm drift downward?

S – Speech: Ask the person to repeat a simple sentence. Is their speech slurred?

T – Time: If you observe any of these signs, call 9-1-1 immediately.

Although, your stroke risk increases with age, a stroke can happen to anyone at any time. About 15% of ischemic strokes occur in young adults and adolescents.

The need for public awareness surrounding stroke prevention and awareness has never been greater. Despite being a leading cause of adult long-term disability, and the fifth leading cause of death, less than one in five Americans can correctly classify all stroke symptoms. This May, during National Stroke Awareness month, get to know your stroke risk factors and learn to better identify the signs and symptoms of stroke. The life you save just might be your own. 
