This weekend we begin a new liturgical year with the first Sunday of Advent. It is a relief to move beyond the scripture passages from the last month focusing on the "end times." I am certainly ready to focus on the Advent message of joy as we anticipate the Christmas message of eternal hope. We eagerly await the celebration of Christmas itself. It is a time to put old ways behind us and embrace the freshness of the Christian message. That is the very message of Advent; to focus on the joy, peace and love of the Christ. When we see the confused youth trying to make sense of their friends' mean behavior, we see the presence of Christ. When we see so many so close to us seeking our attention in love, we see the presence of Christ.

This week may we spend some time every day becoming aware of the presence of Christ as it may be the only thing we can offer, to just be aware of Christ among us.

We hope to inspire all of you to become more engaged than ever before! We need your help to make our parish successful and inspirational for all.

Question of the Week

In what ways do I need to straighten out to follow Jesus?

Advent

Advent marks the beginning of the Ecclesiastical year. During this season the faithful are encouraged to worthily prepare themselves to celebrate Jesus' coming into the world as the incarnate God of love.



Pope Francis said that to prepare the way of the Lord's coming, it is necessary to remind of ourselves of Saint John the Baptist's invitation for conversion. He said that we are called to fill the 'valleys' caused by coldness and indifference, opening ourselves to others with the same sentiments as Jesus, that is, with affection and fraternal attention which takes on the needs of our neighbors. This means that one cannot have a relationship of love, charity and fraternity with one's neighbors if there are "gaps" just as one cannot travel a road with many potholes or obstacles. This requires a change of attitude.

There is a need to curtail the indifference caused by pride and arrogance. How many people, perhaps without realizing it, are proud, are indifferent, lack that kindly relationship. It is necessary to overcome this by making concrete gestures of reconciliation with our brothers and sisters. It is not easy to reconcile with another. One always thinks: "who will take the first step?" The Lord helps us in this if we are of good will. Indeed, conversion is complete if it leads us to humbly recognize our errors, our infidelity and failings. We must not allow ourselves to succumb to the mentality of the world, because the center of our life should be Jesus and His word of light, love and solace. It is He!

Pope Francis said Saint John the Baptist invited the people of his time to conversion, with force, with vigor and with firmness. Nevertheless, he knew how to listen, he knew how to perform gestures of tenderness, gestures of forgiveness toward the multitude of men and women who went to him to confess their sins and to be baptized with the baptism of repentance. Thus, let each of us ask ourselves: how can I change something in my attitude, in order to prepare the way of the Lord?

Survival Sack Opportunities



Holy Spirit parishioners continue to volunteer to distribute Survival Sacks at Sacred Heart Community Center. We gather on the **first and third Thursdays of the month** to distribute Survival Sacks, organize supplies, make hygiene kits, and fill backpacks. Sacks are provided to those who are homeless and living on the streets of San Jose, usually about 40 on each distribution day. We have the privilege of looking for the face of Christ in each of our clients.

Starbucks Coffee supports the Survival Sack Program by providing coffee for our clients. Coffee is provided by the Starbucks at Old Almaden Road and Curtner and by the Starbucks at Monterey Highway and Alma (near Sacred Heart).

Survival Sacks will be distributed on **Thursday, December 5th and Thursday, December 12th** (note this is the second Thursday as Sacred Heart is distributing food and/or toys on the third Thursday of December). FAITH FORMATION

A Refresher why we do what we do! Part 4



What is the wafer you all are receiving, and can I get one, too?

The Source and Summit of everything we do as Catholics is the Eucharist, aka: Holy Communion. Jesus said in the Gospel of John 6:51, "I am the living bread that came down from heaven; whoever eats this bread will live forever; and the bread that I will give is my flesh for the life of the world."

We take this very literally. At the Last Supper Jesus took bread and wine, blessed them and said, "This is my body" "This is my blood" and "Do this in memory of me." (Luke 22) We take this, with the Gospel of John very literally, too. Jesus' Sacrifice for us on the Cross is what we celebrate at Mass. He made that Sacrifice once and for all, but told us to participate in it, too. Our celebration of this Sacrifice isn't a new one; it brings the one and only Sacrifice into the present. The hosts and wine change from those elements to His True Presence—to the Body and Blood of Christ. It's not a symbol for us. It's a reality. And so, we ask that only those who are united with us in that belief through the Catholic Church participate in receiving Communion.

PASTORAL CARE



Prayer Partner Ministry

The Pastoral Care office receives multiple requests every day for prayers for various needs. While names can be added to the weekly Prayers of the Faithful (Intercessions) for a short time, many times prayers are needed for a longer time or require privacy.

Prayer Partners commit to praying for specific people and their needs, daily or more often, as led by the Holy Spirit. The Director of Pastoral Care and a Prayer Partner Lead allocate to each minister the *first name only* of a prayer need by email. Ministers agree to necessary confidentiality boundaries.

Prayers of petition allow us to place ourselves in a position of trust in God, without any demands for a particular outcome. Prayer does not change God and may not result in changed outcomes, but it does change us. With open hands, we become receptive to what may come and more aware of the spirit of God working in our world. One caring Prayer Partner shares, "The prayer ministry is truly rewarding for me. Somehow in praying for others, there is a loving calm and peace within me also. Thank you for allowing me to participate and, hopefully, God in his way will answer all of our prayers."

Sacred Heart Volunteering

Sacred Heart Community Service needs volunteers for the Volunteer Income Tax Assistance (VITA) program. No tax return preparation experience required! While previous tax return knowledge is helpful, the United Way provides free, IRS-certified training for volunteers starting soon. Training will be in early December. After you indicate your interest, you will be contacted to confirm when tax training will begin. The VITA program offers free tax help to people who make less than \$54,000 per year, persons with disabilities and others who need assistance preparing their tax returns.



Sacred Heart's VITA site will run on Tuesdays and Thursdays from 2 pm to 8 pm, and Sundays from 10 am to 4 pm, starting in late January 2020.
