

Texas Flooding Impacts HSP Mission Trip Partners

All of us have seen images from television and internet showing the devastation that the Hurricane Harvey unleashed on the Houston, Texas area. While the people of Texas are bouncing back, it will take months and possibly years to recover from such incredible damage. Catholic Charities in Houston has done incredible things to support the recovery and all of our funds last weekend went to their efforts. We will continue to support their efforts there.



Each year for the last two years 50 parishioners from Holy Spirit Parish have traveled to San Augustine, Texas in February for our annual winter mission trip. We have partnered with *Next Step Ministries* to support the San Augustine and Broaddus communities - located 155 miles northeast of Houston. These are incredibly poor communities. Hurricane Harvey has caused some

flooding and damage throughout the county, but no lives have been lost.

As many of us witnessed during our visits, the residents of San Augustine take care of others in need and rely on their faith to get them through tough times. Sheldon Hardy, the Pastor of White Rock Baptist Church and our host while in San Augustine, is supporting three churches who are sheltering residents in the counties south of San Augustine that were severely impacted by the storm. Pastor Sheldon is also supporting a location in Richmond, Texas that is housing police and highway patrol officers. Sheldon has been providing funds, water and Sunday school books for the families in the shelters.

Following consultation with our mission trip leaders, sleeping bags we purchased for last year's mission trip are being donated by Pastor Sheldon to one of the churches that is housing over 200 people. The road to recovery will be long for so many people in Texas, but with support from people like Sheldon, his parish and people like you they will get through.



We will be assessing the possibility of doing a specific, short-term mission trip to Texas to aid in their relief before our regularly scheduled one in February. The Liturgical Reforms Made in Vatican II

Addressing a group of liturgical experts, Pope Francis said that after the teaching of the Second Vatican Council (1962-65) and a long path of experience, "We can affirm with certainty and magisterial authority that the liturgical reform is irreversible." By "liturgical reform," Pope Francis meant the changes in Catholic rituals and modes of worship which followed from Vatican II, the most immediately visible elements of which included Mass facing the congregation, the use of vernacular languages, and a stronger emphasis on the "full, conscious and active" participation of the people. Francis said that the bishops wanted a liturgy that is "alive" for a Church "fully enlivened by the celebrated mysteries."

He then gives three keys to a "living" liturgy: it's centered in Christ, it involves the people, and works as a "school of Christian life." The liturgy is alive, he said, because of the "lively presence of Him who 'dying has destroyed our death, and by rising, restored our life.'" Without the presence of Christ, Francis insisted, there's not liturgical vitality, just like there's no human life without a beating heart.

Liturgy is also alive because it involves the entire people of the Church, he said, and by its nature it's "popular" and not "clerical" because "it's an action for the people, but also by the people."

In her prayer, Francis said, the Church welcomes all those who have the heart to listen to the Gospel, without discarding anyone, not "rich or poor, young or old, healthy or sick, righteous or sinners."

Lastly, he said the liturgy must work as a school of life, "transforming one's way of thinking and living, not just filling up a bag of ideas about God." The liturgy, Francis insisted, is not simply "a doctrine to understand or a rite to fulfill," it's a "source of life and light for our path of faith.

"There's a big difference between hearing that God exists, and feeling that he loves us, just as we are, here and now," he said. In the liturgical prayer, he said, Catholics experience a communion that finds its meaning not in an abstract thought but in an action made "by God and us, Christ and the Church." "The harmony of the ritual traditions, gives voice to the one prayer for Christ, with Christ and in Christ, for the glory of the Father and for the salvation of the world," he said.

Report Misconduct

Those responsible for the spiritual and material goods of the Church are entrusted with the stewardship of others' gifts, and are ultimately responsible to the Lord. As a faithful steward, the Roman Catholic Diocese of San Jose is committed to maintaining the highest standards of conduct and ethics. The mission of the Church requires no less. To this end, the Diocese of San Jose has partnered with

EthicsPoint to provide a confidential method to hear suggestions, concerns or reports of financial misconduct. The EthicsPoint Hotline allows parishioners, volunteers, employees, vendors and others to make confidential reports regarding the mismanagement of parish or school property, cash and all other assets. Reportable are also issues of apparent disregard of policies pertaining to the proper management of these assets. Suspected unethical behavior by employees, volunteers, staff, trustees, officers, directors, agents or contractors of the Diocese should also be made to EthicsPoint. All reports may be made anonymously.

It is the hope of the Diocese that EthicsPoint will assist in the protection of all who interact with the parishes, schools, chancery and other diocesan agencies. EthicsPoint accepts reports of financial misconduct through its website or Hotline: 1-888-325-7863. A complete report will be made to diocesan leadership, so that leadership may review and provide feedback and resolution for the issues that are reported.

FAITH FORMATION

Why do we celebrate Catechetical Sunday on September 17?

In 1935, the Vatican published On the Better Care and Promotion of Catechetical Education, a document that asks every country to acknowledge the importance of the Church's teaching ministry and to honor those who serve the Christian community as catechists. For the first few years after Catechetical Sunday was established, national catechetical congresses were held in conjunction with the celebration. Beginning in 1971, the USCCB's Department of Education began producing materials to help parishes celebrate the event at the local level. The United States Conference of Catholic Bishops has designated the third Sunday in September as Catechetical Sunday.

Those whom the community has designated to serve as catechists will be called forth to be commissioned for their ministry. Catechetical Sunday is a wonderful opportunity to reflect on the role that each person plays, by virtue of Baptism, in handing on the faith and being a witness to the Gospel. Catechetical Sunday is an opportunity for all to rededicate themselves to this mission as a community of faith.

What Does the Word "Catechetical" Mean?

The word might be more familiar than you think. Many Catholics have used the word "catechism" for years, and they know it has something to do with the compendium of the Church's teachings. The root word, "catechesis," is from a Greek word meaning "to echo, or resound." Catechesis is the act of resounding or bringing the Church's teachings to the world. A catechist is one who teaches in the name of the Church.

Depression in Seniors



As we grow older, we face significant life changes that can put us at risk for depression.

Causes and risk

factors that contribute to depression in older adults and the elderly include:

- Health problems - Illness and disability; chronic or severe pain; cognitive decline; damage to body image due to surgery or disease.
- Loneliness and isolation - Living alone; a dwindling social circle due to deaths or relocation; decreased mobility due to illness or loss of driving privileges.
- Reduced sense of purpose - Feelings of purposelessness or loss of identity due to retirement or physical limitations on activities.
- Fears - Fear of death or dying; anxiety over financial problems or health issues.
- Recent bereavement - The death of friends, family members, and pets; the loss of a spouse or partner.

Depression not only makes you feel sick - with aches, pains, and fatigue - it actually makes physical health worse. Depression also gets in the way of memory and concentration. In fact, it can have such an impact on thinking that it's sometimes mistaken for dementia.

But depression is not a normal or necessary part of aging, and it can be successfully treated. You can feel better and enjoy your golden years once again, no matter what challenges you face.


