Lenten Series with Fr. Brendan

The journey of Lent is a call to conversion of our entire lives back to God's way for us. It starts out humbly with ashes on our heads on Ash Wednesday asking us to fast, pray and give alms on a 40-day journey. This season calls us to voluntarily walk through the desert of our lives to reflect more deeply on the choices we make each day. The purpose of the Lenten journey is to help us refocus on our attention in life back to God's desire for us. Most of us know this journey well and most of try to take it seriously. We attend prayer sessions and go to Mass daily or at least pray more often and more intently each day.

It concludes with the Triduum celebrating Jesus' last three days starting with Good Friday and concluding with Easter Sunday. Again, most of us try to take Good Friday seriously and we fast from one meal and abstain from meat if at all possible. It is a good journey and one that most of us enjoy insofar as we deepen our discipleship just a little. While it might be hard at times, it is also a healthy Lenten cleanse.

It seems every Catholic comes out for Easter Sunday and we are glad to see them but it is always a shame that we cannot get them

here earlier to celebrate more of the Lenten journey especially the last three days.

This year we are doing something different. We invite you to come to two preparation sessions for the Passion. They are intended to help us experience an evening of prayer and reflection. It is my hope that you will come and you will encourage, cajole and accompany some of your family and friends to these evenings. Each session is stand-alone evening but it is best to come to both.

The two sessions are **"Agony in The Garden" on Wednesday, March 21st from 7:00-8:30 p.m. and the "Meaning of the Cross" on Thursday, March 22nd from 7:00-8:30 p.m.** In the session on the Agony in the garden I will focus on what really happened in this garden and why the garden is important. Remember the garden is an ancient symbol for "lover's" and that theme is repeated throughout the Old Testament scriptures.

What Jesus undergoes in the Garden of Gethsemane is a "lover's dilemma" insofar as he had to accept that his lover, humanity itself, had betrayed him. He is left alone to suffer this humiliation on his own. He reconciles this reality by relying on the one love that never abandons him, God the father's love. It was in the garden of Gethsemane that Jesus had to face the reality of his human and divine selves clashing. He could live as a human and accept the suffering that was about to unfold or he could exercise his divine side and confront the abusive authorities that wanted him dead. He chose to reconcile these two natures by embracing both realities and ultimately doing what the Father asked of him. That is to love in a different way.

He had spent the last 3 years in public ministry preaching the good news, healing the sick and needy and reaching out to the peripheries of his society. He was active in his love for others. Now he needed to be passive in his love. That transitions us to the second session about the passion. The root word for passion is the latin, *passio*, meaning literally "passive." This is Jesus "passive love" in action. That means he had to endure the abuse, torture, taunting and eventually a cruel death. And he did not fight back. He absorbed in all that hatred, ugliness, pettiness. The cross becomes the victory but he first must endure all of it as human and divine. He was more a water purifier than an electrical cord. An electrical cord passes on whatever it receives, full voltage. Jesus acts more like a water purifier in that he absorbs all the poisons and toxins and gives back pure clean water. Jesus Christ takes away all the sin of the world and gives back forgiveness. He takes in hatred and gives back love, takes in anger and gives back graciousness, takes in envy and gives back blessing, takes in bitterness and gives back warmth, takes in pettiness and gives back compassion, takes in chaos and gives back peace, takes in sin and gives back forgiveness.

I invite you to join me on these two nights and we will pray and reflect on the power of these three last days of Christ and understand why they are so powerful. I ask you to come to both nights but I understand if you can only make one night. I also ask you to invite a friend to join you. Together we will make this Holy Week a week that changes our lives forever.

The Penitential Rite

Lent is a season during which we look into our own lives in preparation to receive the incredible gift of salvation we celebrate at Easter. In order to ready ourselves, we as a Church take great care to remember our shortcomings -- those times when

we were not our best selves as followers and living vessels of Christ. One way the Diocese of San Jose helps us with this is through the Lenten "The Light is On For You" campaign, where the sacrament of Reconciliation is made available every Wednesday from 6:00-8:00 p.m. at every parish in the Diocese. Another way we can present our sins to God is through one of the oldest traditions within our Sunday Liturgy: the Penitential Rite.

The Penitential Rite, in English, is named after the word "Penitence," which is defined as, "the action of feeling or showing sorrow and regret for having done wrong." During this rite, **we bring to mind our sins and ask for the Lord's forgiveness, so that we may receive His grace in the sacrament of the Eucharist.** It's for this general absolution of sins and preparation of our souls that the Penitential Rite is one of the first things we celebrate at the beginning of Mass. After the Gathering Rite, the main celebrant greets the gathered Assembly, asking them to call to mind their failings and shortcomings. After a brief moment reflection, the priest does one of three things: 1) he either invites the assembly to recite to Confiteor, a statement of general confession, 2) he blesses and sprinkles holy water on the Assembly as a baptismal reminder (on Sundays during Easter), or 3) he begins the Kyrie.

The words, "Kyrie Eleison" may sound familiar as words we hear during Mass every day. But the words themselves are the only words of the Latin Rite to be chanted in the Rite's original Greek language. The words, "Kyrie Eleison, Christe Eleison, Kyrie Eleison" mean, "Lord, have mercy; Christ, have mercy; Lord, have mercy." This is used as an acclamation by the Assembly, separated by a trope or verse recited or sung by the priest or cantor. After this Act of Penitence, the priest leads the Assembly in prayer, having received a general absolution for their sins and prepared themselves to receive the Word of God and the Sacrament of the Altar.

As we continue our Lenten journey toward the glory of Christ's resurrection at Easter, let us remember our own imperfection and present ourselves to God, so that we may more fully and readily celebrate with Him, both in the mystery of the Altar, and in the Kingdom of God.



Middle School Science



The address is 80 South Market Street in San Jose, next to the Cathedral. Follow the breezeway to the side entrance and take the elevator to the second floor.


