What "harvests" is your parish called to reap?



In today's gospel Jesus says, "Let the dead bury their dead." Yikes! That seems so harsh! Why does Jesus come out against the would-be disciples as so demanding? It happens many times in the scriptures and today is one fine example. But why?

This is the evangelist Luke's way of making it clear to all would-be disciples that Jesus does not just want us to "sort of" follow him but Jesus wants us to follow him with our complete selves. And that is demanding! Luke is trying to encourage all who were in the communities he was writing this gospel for to commit completely to Christ and the way of this new life. Time and time again he warns the would-be disciples, through the words of Jesus, that this life will have its challenges, suffering and pains but it will have its just rewards too, especially in the eternal life. Luke writes to a community that is very diverse and it was meant to be open to all who would walk with Jesus. St. Paul, in his own writings, makes this even clearer. We need to give over our complete selves. It reminds me of the poem I read to you some years ago about God coming to rent our house. It speaks of giving our complete selves to the Lord. Maybe we can give the Lord another room; he will not throw us out! Happy 4th of July and Independence Day.

I know, says God, but I can't tell you about that.. You'll have to discover it for yourself. That can only happen if you let me have the whole house.

A bit risky, I say.

Yes, says God, but try me.

I'm not sure – I'll let you know.

I can wait, says God, I like what I see.

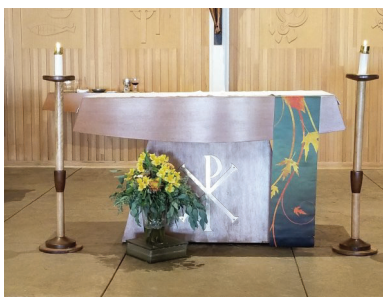

LIVING THE LITURGY

Mensa

We have returned to the green of Ordinary Time. This long stretch between Easter and Advent quietly teaches us the lessons of how to walk in the way of the Lord.



Week by week this season celebrates the wonder of time and the hope of salvation. It is a good time to reflect on the signs and symbols we see each time we enter our church and explore what they really mean to our celebration of the Eucharist.

By far the most prominent symbol in the sanctuary is the altar table. The top of the altar is called "*mensa*" – the Latin word for tabletop. When a new altar is first put into use, the Ordinary Bishop anoints the *mensa* with Sacred Chrism. It makes it the Altar of Sacrifice.

It becomes holy and is to be revered at all times. Thus, it should be covered with a cloth and only sacred objects can be placed on it, e.g. the Roman Missal, and the sacred vessels. Florals, candles or any decorations should be placed around the altar and near it but not on the mensa. For candles, however, they may be placed on the altar, nevertheless, it should not impede any clear view of what takes place at the altar.

Saturday Lunch Ministry

We meet in the Parish Hall at 10:30 a.m. to make sandwiches and then pack the lunches, which include sandwiches, fruit, cookie, and a drink.

After the lunches have been made, we drive to the St. James Park area of downtown San Jose. The **lunches are distributed** to everyone in the park. When everyone has been served, part of the group follows the light rail tracks into the center of the city and distributes lunches as they walk. The part of the group who remains in the park **cleans up litter**. Even litter that isn't part of the Holy Spirit lunches will be cleared away.

We invite ten families to join us **next Saturday**. We ask for a one to one ratio of adults to students as parents need to be with their child especially during the distribution in St. James Park. Student participation is limited to sixth grade and older.

A donation of \$10 is asked from each family to cover the cost of food and supplies.

How Can We Better Our Prayer Lives?

Make prayer a habit: One way to do something well is to

do it consistently, and this is especially true in prayer. Designate a special time for prayer every day, and stick to it.

Ask God to teach you how to pray:

Ask God to come and be with you. For example, pray: "Father, please teach me to pray. Come Holy Spirit, please teach me to pray. Jesus, please be close to me and help me to know you more."

Be real with God: God knows our thoughts, so there is no need to hide what you think! Just like being a friend to someone, you can't grow closer to God when you aren't yourself.

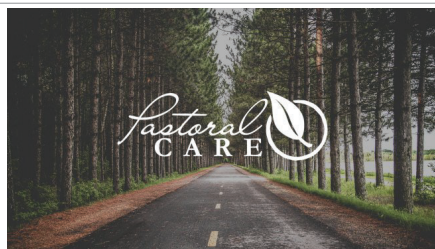
Adore God: Prayer is more than just speaking to Him. Just being with Him is enough, whether that is physically in mass, adoration, or spiritually in prayer. Prayer is also the desire of union with God, and that desire doesn't have to be spoken to be real.

Listen: This is something that can be hard to accomplish. Lectio Divina is a great way to start, because through the Scriptures, Jesus' words are living and active, and they speak to our heart. So open up your bible and let Jesus' words not only be to the other people in the bible, but to YOU.

Another way to hear God is to see where He guides your thoughts and emotions during prayer.

If you are struggling, don't give up: Praying isn't something that always comes automatically. Sometimes it is easy, and sometimes it is hard. Don't give up!

A Village of Support, Part 3

Pastoral Care Eucharist to the Homebound—a Holy Spirit Ministry

Even more than the reflexive feeling of empathy, *compassion* triggers a responsive desire to alleviate the suffering of another. The Pastoral Care to the Sick and Homebound Ministry seeks to bring the Eucharist to those who cannot be with us for Mass, whether temporarily or ongoing. The primary concern of the pastoral care minister is to show the sick how much Christ and his Church is concerned for them. We bring Christ’s love in the form of the Eucharist, the Word of God in scripture and prayer, and the Body of Christ as community.

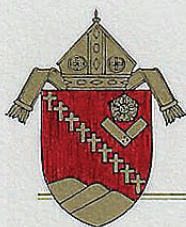
Pastoral Care Eucharist to the Hospitalized—a Diocesan Ministry

Each parish is responsible for the care of those within its parish “boundaries”. When Holy Spirit is aware of the hospitalization of its parishioners, the priests and staff make every effort to visit when medically appropriate. But hospitals within the Diocese also fall under the direct ministry of the neighboring parish. When you or a loved one are hospitalized, just ask the nursing staff to arrange for a Communion visit and the local volunteer ministers will respond. In the case of urgent pastoral care, hospitals can contact the Diocesan On-Call clergy for the Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick.

Online Streaming of Sunday Morning Mass--a Holy Spirit Ministry

When a parishioner is homebound but would like to “see and hear” mass at Holy Spirit, help them visit the parish website at holyspiritchurch.org and click on the Video & LiveStream link at the left side. Locate the video screen at the top of the Videos page. Check the sound volume level and click the arrow to play. Live Stream is turned “online” during most Sunday morning mass times by our wonderful sound/music ministers. Singing along is encouraged!

Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

As you know, the California legislature is considering Senate Bill 360, a law that would take away the Seal of Confession from priests and from everyone who works with priests in parishes and Church agencies across the state.

The Diocese of San Jose agrees with the intention behind SB 360: that all youth should be protected from sexual abuse. However, clergy and ministers are already “mandated reporters” — which means that when they hear information about suspected child abuse, they are required to report this to law enforcement, unless priests hear of it during a celebration of the Sacrament, under the Seal of Confession. Moreover, hearings on the bill have not presented a single case — in California or anywhere else — where child abuse would have been prevented if a priest had disclosed information he had heard in confession.

To assist you with conversations that you may have on this topic within your communities, my staff has developed the attached “Frequently Asked Questions” (FAQs) about SB 360.
