Our Path to **Reconciliation and Healing**

From the Diocese

As you saw this week, Bishop McGrath and the Diocese of San Jose released the names of clergy with credible allegations of sexual abuse of children as part of the commitment to transparency and accountability to assist in the process of reconciliation and healing for victims/survivors.

With the release of the list, the Bishop expressed his deepest apologies for the actions of those who were in positions of authority and who violated that sacred trust by abusing children. The Bishop also voiced his commitment to continue to improve upon the vigilance, training, and prevention efforts that have been in place since 2002.

The Bishop personally encouraged other victims/survivors to come forward. Anyone who has been a victim of sexual abuse by anyone working on behalf of the Church is urged to contact civil authorities (police department or sheriff's office) and then to contact the Office for the Protection of Children and Vulnerable Adults at 408-983-0113 or opcva.ethicspoint.com.

The bishop has designated October as a month of repentance for clergy at every parish in the Diocese. At Holy Spirit we will modify our Sunday liturgies as follows:

- The church environment will be simplified like Lent and purple vestments will be used, the color of repentance.
- The presider will not wear any vestment at all during Mass but instead lay the vestment over the presider's chair and sit in a chair beside the presider's chair as a symbol of humility.
- We will not sing an opening song but use the sound bowl as we process.
- The presider will also prostrate fully before the altar asking for forgiveness for the sins of our brother-priests and our bishops.
- We will have special prayers throughout the liturgy for forgiveness and healing.
- Fr. Edgar will lead an adoration prayer service every Friday from 7:00-8:00 p.m.
- The priests will also fast one day each week in repentance.

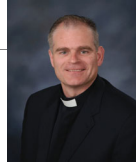

NOTE FROM OUR PASTOR



On October 18, the Diocese of San Jose published the list of priests assigned in our diocese who have been credibly accused of child abuse. It has been in the newspapers and on television. This is part of the diocese's commitment for transparency and accountability to assist in the process of reconciliation and healing for the victims.

The individuals on this list were assigned to a parish and/or diocesan ministry in Santa Clara County by the Bishop of San Jose or, in the years before our founding in 1981, by the Archbishop of San Francisco. We have included all known assignments as part of our commitment to transparency. There is also a Frequently Asked Questions (FAQ). For more information about the list, please go to www.dsj.org/disclosurelist.

The Bishops and the diocese will continue to contribute to this commitment for transparency and accountability with an independent review of the clergy personnel files beginning in November. As a result of that process, names or information may be added to the list.

On that list are two priests who either had an assignment or presided at Masses at Holy Spirit Parish, Fr. Phil McCrillis and Fr. Bob Gray. I hope and pray that there were no further victims here in our parish but if anyone has been a victim of sexual abuse by anyone working on behalf of the Church, please contact civil authorities (police department or sheriff's office) and then the Office for the Protection of Children and Vulnerable Adults at 408-983-0113 or opcva.ethicspoint.com.

We continue to pray for victims. We hope they find their voice and begin healing in this time of truth-bearing.

On a more positive note, **I want to share something with you that is an awesome weekly experience for me.**

Our new principal, Maureen Christensen, asked Fr. Edgar and myself to consider greeting the children and parents as they drive up and drop off their children. So, each week

Fr. Edgar and I do so once or twice a week and I absolutely love it. I have such a better appreciation of how much the children love our school. They make me smile every Wednesday as I greet them. They love coming to school and are always smiling. The school does a great job with our children!

Saturday Lunch Ministry

Please consider joining us in an exciting way to serve others!

We will **meet in the Parish Office at 10:30 a.m.** to make sandwiches and then pack the lunches, which include sandwiches, fruit, cookie, and a drink. Then we drive to the St. James Park area of downtown San Jose. The sandwiches are distributed to everyone in the park. When everyone has been served, part of the group follows the light rail tracks into the center of the city and distributes sandwiches as they walk. The part of the group who remains in the park cleans up litter. Even litter that isn't part of the Holy Spirit lunches will be cleared away.

We invite ten families to join us **every 1st Saturday of the month.** We ask for a one to one ratio of adults to students as parents need to be with their child especially during the distribution in St. James Park. Student participation is limited to sixth grade and older. A donation of \$10 is asked from each family to cover the cost of food and supplies.

Survival Sacks

Holy Spirit parishioners are continuing to volunteer to distribute Survival Sacks at Sacred Heart Community Center. We gather on the **first and third Thursdays of the month** to distribute Survival Sacks, organize supplies, make hygiene kits, and fill backpacks. Sacks are provided to those who are homeless and living on the streets of San Jose, usually about 50 on each distribution day. We have the privilege of looking for the face of Christ in each of our clients.

We continue to receive support from various Catholic High Schools (Presentation, Mitty, and St. Francis) as well as from several local parishes. Also Starbucks on Monterey near Sacred Heart and Starbucks on Curtner near Old Almaden Road continue to provide coffee for our clients who are most appreciative of their support. Finally the American Association of University Women and the Sunnyvale Moose Lodge have recently made donations. We appreciate all of their support and hope you will thank them as well should you have contact with anyone from these organizations.

Our greatest need (as far as supplies for the program) is for men's underwear. If you would like to donate underwear to the Survival Sack Program, contact us via our e-mail listed below.

The Thanksgiving and Christmas seasons are opportunities for us to celebrate the good gifts God has given us. 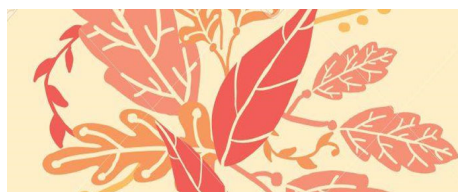
Edge Middle School Ministry

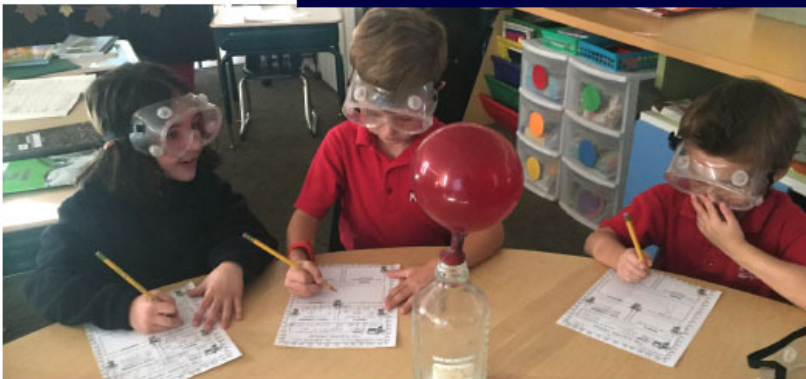
