As a disciple of Jesus, how do I love others?

It is often said that actions speak louder than words. And it is true on so many levels. If we believe something in our heart or if we proclaim some stance we have taken loudly with words, there is nothing more powerful that convinces people of our conviction for things than just doing what we believe and/or proclaim.

So many times, throughout the scriptures, Jesus wanted the crowds to understand in their hearts what he believed and what he was proclaiming but his actions were the most convincing of all. Every time he loved others with actions that spoke louder than his words and his words were really powerful. Yes, actions speak louder than words.



This week we lost one of our living saints, Jean Vanier. He was a man who lived his beliefs in his actions every single day. Jean Vanier, founder of L'Arche (1964), a community which supports people with disabilities, died during the week, aged 90. The community is active all over the world with about 150 centers.

Vanier once said that the mission of every Christian is to encounter Christ in every person who suffers in weakness or poverty. He spent his entire serving those in a world of extreme weakness, poverty and suffering, people who had often been rejected. Jean Vanier recalled the importance of living together: "I believe strongly that today it is necessary to create communities that live the values of the Gospel: to live together, to live the Beatitudes and to discover that the life of the Beatitudes, the life of the Gospel can be lived very simply by living together. The message of the Gospel is to become men and women of compassion. If you become a man or a woman of compassion, you will be like Jesus."

He influenced a generation of believers and will be remembered for his tremendous humility. He received every possible award and recognition but never wanted the spotlight and would always point that light to those he served and to whom he credited all his learning. One person that Vanier influenced greatly was Fr. Henri Nouwen who lived and died at the L'Arche Community. Nouwen was one of the most prolific writers and theologians of our modern era and he credited Vanier with his renewed faith in the Church and in God. Vanier truly lived his faith in action every day. May he rest in peace.

Today we also celebrate Mother's Day and I believe that most mothers live their faith in action through their families often in thankless and unnoticed ways. You have heard me tell many stories about my own mother whom I loved dearly and miss still. One of her greatest attributes was her open heart to those less well-off than our family. She would always give to those who were poor and needy no matter what. What is the attribute of your mother that you admire most? Maybe you can tell them so this Sunday, if they are still alive. And if not, then in prayer, tell them how much you still admire and love them for their example of love. Today may we not only choose some words to express our affection for our mothers but may we use some actions because those are more powerful every time. Happy Mother's Day to all mothers.

#### LIVING THE LITURGY

#### **Sacred Images**

"In Christ, God has now lifted the veil from His face (The Spirit of Liturgy - Ratzinger, p.116)."



Many non-Catholics misunderstand the

way we pray with sacred images. They put it in a context of worshipping idols. When Jesus took the human flesh as His own image, God revealed His true image to humanity. He became True God and True Man. As Pope Benedict wrote, "God no longer completely conceals Himself but now shows Himself in the form of the Son." This is the way the sacred images relate in our prayer. They awaken our senses and lead us to prayer and contemplation.

They are not simply art but a revelation of the Truth. They tell us the story of how God works throughout the history of man. The images of biblical scenes are not only a kind of pictorial history lesson but narratives, calling to mind the events that make our faith present. The Catechism of the Catholic Church (CCC) paragraph 2131, tells us that the Incarnate word, the Son of God, introduced a new "economy" of images.

This is the same thing that we do when praying with images of the Saints. Indeed, "the honor rendered to an image passes to its prototype," and "whoever prays with an image, prays with the person portrayed in it." It is respectful and not adoration. Therefore, a sacred image is a form of liturgy that helps us understand the revealed truth, the incarnation of the Word of God.

#### **Saturday at Sacred Heart**


