How do I let the Holy Spirit guide my ability to forgive others?

It is often said that when "one door closes another door opens." That is so true for all transitions of life. Over these weeks, lots of students graduate from school and enter into one of these transitions. The door of one



school closes but another door of their new

school opens. It can be a time full of great joy and excitement. But it can also be a time of stress and anxiety especially as they head off to a new school in a different place to attend university. It is also a time of transition for parents who also adjust to this time of transition. It is a letting go for them too. With all of this change, what can help us?

You will not surprised to hear that I strongly believe we need to dig deeper into our spiritual lives and get some extra "prayer" into our schedule. This prayer should give us the extra time to "open our hands and hearts and let go." That sounds so easy, but it can be really difficult. We often get into lots of arguments with our kids as they adjust and push the envelope of their own transitions. We need to model for them a steady heart and open spirit. The Lord has something wonderful in store for us but we cannot receive it unless our hands and hearts are open to receive. How do we calm down and let go? We need solitude and prayer. But it is not the type of solitude that the world offers but that of the Lord. Henri Nouwen puts it beautifully.

"In order to understand the meaning of solitude, we must first unmask the ways in which the idea of solitude has been distorted by our world. We say to each other that we need some solitude in our lives. What we really are thinking of, however, is a time and place for ourselves in which we are not bothered by other people, can think our own thoughts, express our own complaints, and do our own thing, whatever it may be. For us, solitude most often means privacy. We have come to the dubious conviction that we all have a right to privacy. Solitude thus becomes like a spiritual property for which we can compete on the free market of spiritual goods. But there is more. We also think of solitude as a station where we can recharge our batteries, or as a corner of the boxing ring where our wounds are oiled, our muscles massaged, and our courage restored by fitting slogans. In short, we think of solitude as a place where we gather new strength to continue the ongoing competition of life.

But that is not the solitude of St. John the Baptist, of St. Anthony or St. Benedict, of Charles de Foucauld or the brothers of [the] Taizé [Community]. For them solitude is not a private therapeutic place. Rather, it is the place of conversion, the place where the old self dies and the new self is born, the place where the emergence of the new man and the new woman occurs."

We seek a place of conversion where we can let go of the old self and embrace the gift that God offers where the new self can be born. Take some solitude and model for our children how to embrace transition well.

LIVING THE LITURGY

Resurrection, stronger than death

Pope Emeritus Benedict XVI wrote, "Without the Cross and Resurrection, Christian worship is null and void, and the theology of liturgy that omitted any reference to them would



really just be talking about an empty game." It is indeed a truth of revelation.

Faith wouldn't exist without the mysteries of Jesus Christ's suffering, death, and resurrection. Through the cross of Jesus Christ, salvation and true hope came to the world. Jesus Christ, the true God and the true Man, the incarnate Word, who from the beginning was with God, and through Him and for Him, all things were created, is the living and eternal God who fulfilled the promise of salvation.

He alone has the capacity to complete the works of mercy. As our beloved Pope Emeritus also said, Jesus Christ's resurrection is a sign of God's eternal love, the love that emanates between the Trinitarian God. This love brought life to the resurrected body of Christ. Resurrection is, indeed, stronger than death.

Prayer Partner Ministry



The Pastoral Care office receives multiple requests every day for prayers for various needs.

While names can be added to the weekly Prayers of the Faithful (Intercessions) for a short time, many times prayers are needed for a longer time or require privacy.

Prayer Partners commit to praying for specific people and their needs, daily or more often, as led by the Holy Spirit.

The Director of Pastoral Care and a Prayer Partner Lead allocate to each minister the *first name only* of a prayer need by email. Ministers agree to necessary confidentiality boundaries and pray avidly without identity or knowledge of circumstances.

Prayers of petition allow us to place ourselves in a position of complete trust in God, without any demands for particular outcome.
