

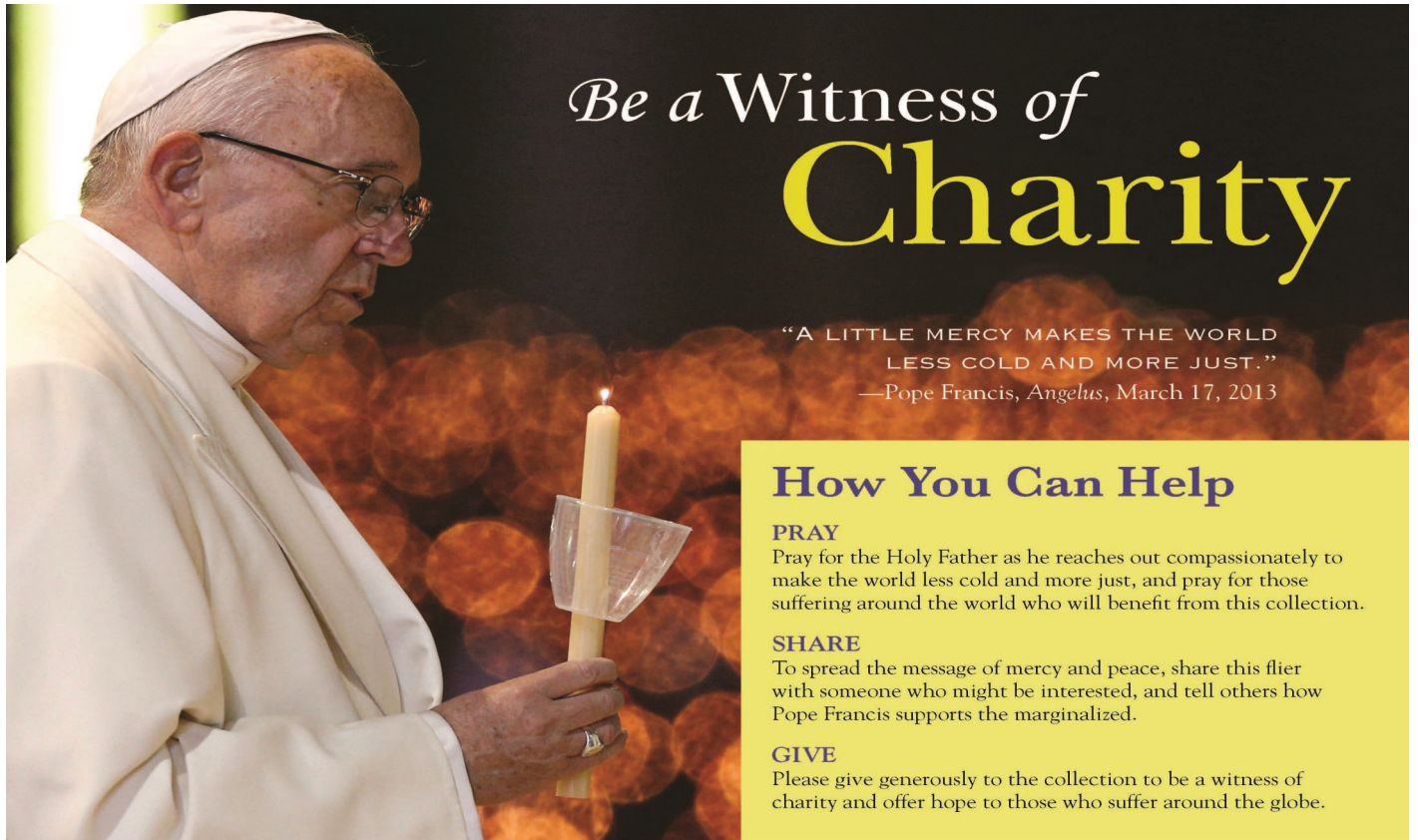

## NOTE FROM OUR PASTOR



Last week I finally caved in and went to have my eyes examined for reading glasses. It has become clear that my eyesight has deteriorated. I currently have two sets of reading glasses: one for reading books and another for using the computer. I am constantly switching between them and often forgetting either of them when going outside my house or office. I have not adjusted my life to the reality of my new situation. It has become problematic for me, but I reluctantly went to the optometrist. We decided that a set of glasses that will transition is best for me. So, I will have to wear glasses all the time and my eyes will adjust. I am reluctant and not sure how I will feel when I get them in a few weeks.

Then something funny happened! I went into the room to select the "frames." The attendant and optometrist were so friendly, cheerful and excited to help me. But I was overwhelmed for a moment. There seemed to be millions of frames in that store. I looked at the walls full of different kinds of frames, from full framed, to thin framed, to partial frames, to no frames and then there were the colors! Yikes! I was so overwhelmed, I let out a long heavy sigh and looked downcast. I was just about to grumble about the whole process when I saw myself in one of those thousand mirrors that surrounded me. I was shocked with what I saw! It looked like the man in the mirror was being tortured or something and that man was me! I was so stunned at his miserable face that I laughed. And then he laughed!

I realized how ridiculous and childish I was being. After all, these new glasses will be a true gift to allow me to see more clearly. Then I thought of all the people of Nicaragua that I will be visiting over the next few weeks who will have no access to eye glasses and will desperately need them to read. I soon became ashamed with my moodiness and started smiling and enjoying the selection of the glasses. I vowed that I would smile and be grateful for not only the gift of the glasses but of life itself.

Sometimes it takes something simple like that to get us back on track. We can become so consumed with our lives that we do not realize how blessed we are with so many gifts. God has blessed us with an abundance of gifts, and he expects us to be grateful and share those gifts with others.

That is why we come to the Eucharist each week. We come to offer "thanksgiving" and realize that we are One Body of Christ and we are called to share what we have with others. Today, be grateful with your life and share whatever you have with others cheerfully.

**The Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ**

The Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ commemorates the importance of the Holy Eucharist. It parallels Holy Thursday, which also commemorates our Lord's institution of the Holy Eucharist. But because Holy Thursday is in Holy Week, a season of silence and repentance, the celebration of *Corpus Christi* was introduced so that the faithful would not lose sight of the significance and the prominence of the Eucharist. The focus of this celebration is on the **real presence of Christ** in the bread and wine which the faithful offer. This work of human hands becomes the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ during the words of consecration at every Mass. Corpus Christi became a feast in the Roman Catholic Church in 1312 by order of Pope Urban IV and was originally celebrated on the Thursday after the Most Holy Trinity Sunday. This tradition continues in some parts of the world. However, in the United States, the celebration is moved to the Sunday following the celebration of the Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity.

Many forms of popular piety grew from this feast, most notably are Eucharistic Adoration and processions. Eucharistic Adoration is common, especially during Holy Week. Less common is a Eucharistic Procession during which the Blessed Sacrament is processed out of the church for the Christian faithful to profess their faith to the public.

**Here at Holy Spirit Parish, we have Eucharistic Adoration on every first Friday of the month at 7:00PM inside the church. Also, we offer the Sacrament of Reconciliation during this time.**

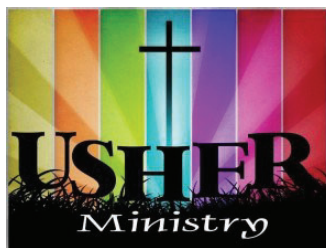

### Saturday Lunch Ministry



We meet in the Parish Hall at 10:30 a.m. to make sandwiches and then pack the lunches, which include sandwiches, fruit, cookie, and a drink.

After the lunches have been made, we drive to the St. James Park area of downtown San Jose. The **lunches are distributed** to everyone in the park.

When everyone has been served, part of the group follows the light rail tracks into the center of the city and distributes lunches as they walk. The part of the group who remains in the park **cleans up litter**. Even litter that isn't part of the Holy Spirit lunches will be cleared away.

We invite ten families to join us **next Saturday**. We ask for a one to one ratio of adults to students as parents need to be with their child especially during the distribution in St. James Park. Student participation is limited to sixth grade and older.

**Summertime Family Activities**

**SENIOR HOUSING OPTIONS**

**A Village of Support, Part 2**

At Holy Spirit Parish, we are blessed by a loving community of faithful and faith-filled members who support one another generously and without expectation when support is needed. Holy Spirit provides ministries in a variety of areas, including grief support and visits to the homebound. But even the church must turn to the “experts” on certain matters, including those who specialize in providing residential support and care for seniors. Whether seeking housing for yourself or a loved one, here’s a handy list of the types of facilities you might encounter here in Santa Clara County.

**ASSISTED LIVING FACILITY (ALF)** – A state licensed community, offering assistance with daily living activities. These facilities have medical personnel assisting with medication, administration, dressing, bathing, and social activities. They normally have Levels of Care that offer a variety of extra services. The Levels of Care indicate an additional monthly fee from the base price.

**CONTINUING CARE RETIREMENT COMMUNITY (CCRC)** – This community is commonly called Life Care. This lifestyle has a campus consisting of Independent Living (I/L), Assisted Living (ALF), and Skilled Nursing (S/N). They typically offer the full selection of amenities associated with retirement living. A large endowment fee in addition to a monthly maintenance fee can be expected.

**PERSONAL CARE FACILITY (P/C)** – This community specializes in caring for the memory-impaired resident. This Extended Care Community commands an additional license from the state as the medical personnel are trained for the special needs of dementia.

**BOARD & CARE HOME** – This is a residential home where 4-6 vulnerable adults live, usually in single rooms, and have access to on-site care services. A home registered as a care home will provide personal care only - help with washing, dressing and giving medication. Some care homes are registered to meet a specific care need, for example dementia or terminal illness.

**RESPITE CARE** – The purpose of respite care is to furnish the primary caregiver a short-term relief from their day-to-day responsibility. This care is available in or away from the home.

**SENIOR HOUSING** – These facilities offer physical care as well as pain and symptom management in apartment style housing with community areas and common dining. In addition, they offer amenities like education, social activity, transportation, culture, health facilities, etc.

**SKILLED NURSING FACILITY (SNF)** – Long-term care facilities that offer 24-hour medical care provided by registered nurses (RN), licensed practical nurses (LPN) and certified nurse assistant (CNA). They also are required to have a house physician. This facility cares for the very frail residents who are dependent on nursing care. This facility typically also has a short-term rehabilitation unit for residents needing rehab between hospital and home.
