## Re Ignite Retreat 2020

March 20-21, 2020

To build a fire from scratch, we have to begin with kindling. Once the kindling has caught fire then we slowly add more sticks, fanning its flames. As the fire grows, we add larger pieces of wood. Every boy or girl scout knows this method of starting a fire. Eventually we can throw a log or even a wet log on it and the fire will be red hot.

Our prayer life is much the same. We have to start off small and slowly grow it until it is a roaring hot fire of the Holy Spirit. Most of us want a strong spiritual and prayer life but we forget we have to start small to get there, just like a fire. Once it has some flames then we can fan it and add more to build it up to the point where it is a red-hot fire of prayer.


Over the years, Fr. Brendan has given many retreats and in reality, only a few of us can come away on a retreat to learn how to pray. Most of these retreatants find the experience of a retreat to be life changing and suggest that we find some way to have more people experience a retreat. So, this year we are bringing the retreat to the whole parish. We will convert the entire parish property into a "retreat center" and have EVERYONE come away on retreat.

Re-Ignite is a Parish wide spiritual retreat that will be held at Holy Spirit on the weekend of **March 20-21, 2020**. The objective of this retreat is to help us to pray. Many people have a desire to have Jesus as part of their lives, but, are so busy that they are not able to find time for to pray with Jesus.

All the sessions are going to be on the Holy Spirit Campus. The gymnasium will be converted into a dining hall. The Parish Hall will be converted into a place of adoration. And the classrooms will be changed into places of prayer or optional private conference rooms for meeting with a spiritual advisor or for optional small group discussions. We are doing everything we can to make this as easy as possible for you to come on retreat and to re-ignite your prayer life.

With the Re-Ignite Retreat being almost 8 weeks away, we are asking for you to please consider attending. We will hold this retreat if we get at least 200 registrations. The cost per person for the retreat, is \$50 if you sign up before February 16<sup>th</sup>. After that time, the cost will be \$75. This cost includes all the meals for the two days of the retreat.

The Retreat will begin on Friday evening, **March 20th at 5:30pm and concludes Saturday evening, March 21st at 8:30pm**. All meals during the retreat will be provided. ### Liturgical Year By USCCB

The liturgical year is made up of six seasons:

- Advent - four weeks of preparation before the celebration of Jesus' birth.
- Christmas- the celebration of the Nativity of Jesus and his manifestation to the entire world.
- Lent - a six-week period of penance before Easter.
- Sacred Paschal Triduum - the holiest "Three Days" of the Church's year, where the Christian people recall the suffering, death, and resurrection of Jesus.
- Easter - 50 days of joyful celebration of the Lord's resurrection from the dead and his sending forth of the Holy Spirit.
- Ordinary Time – a time for the community to consider the fullness of the Lord's teachings and works. It is divided into two sections:

A span of 4-8 weeks after Christmas Time.

Another lasting about six months after Easter Time and before Advent.

Christmas and Easter highlight the central mysteries of Jesus' life, the birth, death on the cross, resurrection, and ascension of Jesus Christ, and the descent of the Holy Spirit at Pentecost. The Sundays and weeks of Ordinary Time, on the other hand, take us through the life of Christ. This is the time of conversion. This is living the life of Christ.

We are now back to Ordinary Time. It is a time for growth and maturation, a time in which the mystery of Christ is called to penetrate more deeply into history until all things are caught up in Christ. The goal, toward which all of history is directed, is represented by the final Sunday in Ordinary Time, the Solemnity of Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe.

In partnership with Amigos for Christ, we work shoulder-to-shoulder with Nicaraguan neighbors to bring clean water, healthcare, education, and economic opportunity to rural communities in need.

These mission trips are for adults and high school age minors. Minors under the age of 18 must be accompanied by a parent or legal guardian

Online registration for the June 13 -20 and June 20-27 Mission trips to Nicaragua are now open on the Holy Spirit website, <https://holyspiritchurch.org/nicaragua-mission-trip/>.

Registration will remain open until Feb. 13th or until all 60 spots each week have been filled. The cost of the trip is \$1450 per person. A non-refundable deposit of \$200 must be paid at registration.

Missionaries will be accepted on a first come/first served basis. All missionaries are expected to travel with the group.


