NOTE FROM OUR PASTOR



Depending on what job we have and whether we are young or old, we speak between 7,000 to 20,000 words a day. Men tend to speak less than women, younger people tend to speak more than older people. So, depending on our personality, we could speak less or more.

Yet with all of these words we speak, there are so many more words coming at us. It is estimated we hear over 40,000 words a day. Again, depending on our lives, we could hear twice that or half that. The question for all of us is, "What are the most important words we say each day and hear each day?"

I submit the most important words are those we don't say nearly enough. "I love you." When we hear those words and they are meant, they are life changing words. When we can allow those words into our heart and know that "we are loved," then we can take on the whole world and it will not matter. When we make a mistake and a loved one says, "Don't worry everything will be okay. Remember I love you." Our lives are reset to normal again. Yes, those words have the power to change lives.

When we allow our hearts to hear God tell us, "I love you," again it is life-changing. Because ultimately in the end, when we realize that God loves us, there is nothing else in life that matters more.

How can we leave more room for those important words to be said and heard? With God, we need to show up in prayer and stop talking. We need to sit and listen with the ears of our heart. When we sit and listen we can hear how God marvels in the simple things we do each day, how God is delighted with our ordinary acts of human love. God will assure us of his love if we allow him.

With others around us, we need to use less words ourselves and allow space for silence first. Then in the silence, we listen for more opportunities to use the right words at the right time. Listening to each other is a start but being willing to say, "I love you" takes courage when we are hurting ourselves, when we are wounded ourselves. To love someone else is to stop focusing on ourselves and instead focus on them, if only for a few minutes.

Today and this week, may we take the time to say and mean, "I love you." Maybe we can use less words and choose more carefully the words we do use. That old nursery rhyme "Sticks and stones may break my bones, but words will never break me" is completely wrong. Words do hurt when used to do so. But when we use the right words, they can heal and forgive the world of sin. Today, let's use those most important words, "I love you."

LIVING THE LITURGY

Mass as a Two-Way Dialogue

For the world in which we live, communication is of monumental importance. Communication is how we exchange information, make connections with one another, and become a community. In the same way that communication is crucial to humanity, it is of incredible significance to our relationship with God.



There are several ways we communicate with God. Private prayer is of the utmost importance, whether it is through reading scripture, rote prayer, or silent meditation. Reconciliation is another mode of communication with God, through which we receive healing as a result of our own willingness to share our shortcomings with Him. The Mass is another form of communication, and is perhaps to most important, as it is by nature a two-way dialogue between God and humanity; a meeting of heaven and earth.

We encounter and interact with God constantly throughout the Mass. God reveals more about himself and gives the world instruction through the readings and homily that we hear during the Liturgy of the Word. We respond as a community in the acclamations we say after each reading, the responsorial psalm we proclaim, and through the intercessory prayer, during which we present to God our prayers for the World, the Church, and each other. God then communicates with us through the Eucharistic Prayer and through Christ's Body that we receive in the Eucharist during Communion.

In his encyclical, *Laudato Si*, Pope Francis states that, "The Eucharist joins heaven and earth; it embraces and penetrates all creation" (*Laudato Si*, par 236). It is true; God embraces all of humanity through the Mass by sharing knowledge of our relationship with Him through the Word and renewing our unity with Him through the Eucharist, "for in the Mass the table of both God's word and of Christ's body is prepared, from which the faithful may be instructed and refreshed" (*GIRM*, no. 28).

As we gather this week, let us not only be prepared to pray to God this week, but to also be attentive the way that God responds. And together, we can gather with an open heart and spirit to have a two-way dialogue with Him.


