



The risen Christ appears to the disciples and assures them of his continued presence in Spirit. He continues to one specific gift—peace. This peace is not a peace the world gives but is a deep peace within our soul; the complete assurance within our very being that what we experience in prayer is real for the whole world; a peace that allows us to be joyful despite the reality of pain and suffering in our lives; it is a peace that assures us that God is alive within us through his Spirit.

As we continue the Easter season, may we choose to live that peace and be grateful to others for the gifts in our lives. Today we choose to see with eyes of faith and accept God's peace.




A Time for You - A Retreat Day for Caregivers


