If your children get squirmy, as we know they can, do not hesitate to get up and walk about the aisle. If they get even more squirmy or noisy do not hesitate to walk in and out of the Church doors. Walk around and come back. Actually, it is easier for us to see you walk up and down the aisle than to pretend they are not squirmy and noisy. We know how it is with kids. They are just children so just walk around and feel at home. Do not feel you disturb us. You do not. We understand because we welcome young families here and we are delighted that you are here.

For those families who find it hard to concentrate with their squirmy, noisy kids, we have daycare for the youngest ones at 9:30am in the Parish Hall Pre-K room. Feel free to check it out. It is your decision and we respect your decision. We want you in the community with us and we want your children to feel at home here too. Thank you

Mission Sunday

Last weekend we celebrated World Mission

WORLD MISSION SUNDAY 2017

Sunday which honors the missions and missionaries of the world. The word for our Liturgy, "Mass", comes from the Latin word, "Missa" which means to send and is also the root of the English word mission. As part of the Dismissal Rite, the priest says: "Go, the Mass has ended". This is more than just saying that this is the end of Mass. What it really means is that the people are being sent out on a mission, literally meaning "Go, meaning you, the Church - has been sent". These few words clearly express the missionary nature of the Church.

As Disciples we are sent out to live the gospel each day in all we say and do. In the Eucharist, the faithful receive the Body and Blood of Christ. We become what we receive. Nourished by what we have received, we respond by becoming the nourishment for others who need it. To be sent means to see the face of the God in every person that we are in contact with.

In 'Joy of the Gospel', Pope Francis writes, "The Church's mission is enlivened by a spirituality of constant exodus. We are challenged to go forth from our own comfort zone in order to reach all the peripheries in need of the light of the Gospel. The Church's mission impels us to undertake a constant pilgrimage across the various deserts of life, through the different experiences of hunger and thirst for truth and justice. The world vitally needs the Gospel of Jesus Christ. Through the Church, Christ continues his mission as the Good Samaritan, caring for the bleeding wounds of humanity, and as Good Shepherd, constantly seeking out those who wander along winding paths that lead nowhere."

At Holy Spirit Parish, there are many opportunities to serve others. There are foreign mission trips and service ministries to local organizations. Each of these provides an opportunity to not only serve people in need but to also bring Christ into their lives. As part of the Word, Worship and Witness initiative there will be more opportunities to minister to the homeless and others in need.

At the end of Mass the priest says to the people, "Go forth to love and serve the Lord" to which the people respond, "Thanks be to God." Having thanked God for the great gift of the Eucharist we are sent to live out the good news of the Gospel.

FAITH FORMATION

Imaginative Prayer Part 3 of 3



Young children

- Younger children will probably need more hands-on guidance, so rather than asking them to spend ten minutes silently imagining the scene, try "playing pretend" with them. Make clear that this is a way of praying!
- Your "pretending" might take the form of shared storytelling. Ask your child to supply the details of the story using some of the question prompts above. It may help to use a children's picture Bible or storybook as a text. Finally, ask: "Well, who would you want to be if you were at the wedding? What would you do? What would you say to Jesus? What would he say to you?"
- Alternatively, you might "act out" your pretending, much as you might play house or store.

As always when you're praying with little ones, aim high but stay relaxed about the outcome. If things fall apart the first time you try, try again some other time. It sometimes takes experienced Jesuits a while to "get in the groove" with imaginative prayer!
