

This week we celebrated Valentine's Day and we celebrated love in their lives. I found this year, more than ever, there was a great emphasis on

"romantic love." By this I mean it seemed more than ever co-opted by Hallmark and the commercial expression of love. In other



words, buy your loved one something and tell her or him you love them with this "product" which is usually something expensive! While I don't hold that against the stores and businesses after all they are just trying to stay in business, but I want to recapture the significance of "real love."

By that I mean the hard work and choice of loving your spouse, child, parent, or friend. This type of love is the daily work of discipleship and requires great commitment and dedication to be our best selves all the times. I still think that married is the best example of this type of love because it is in the crucible of the married life that those tough choices have to be made. No doubt that there are many days when you and your spouse love each other dearly and it is easy to love them because they are kind, gentle and caring. But there are other days when it is very hard because they are selfish, bitter and unkind. On those days, we still need to choose to love them because of our commitment in marriage. In a society where commitment is getting harder to understand or witness, married love stands out as a primal witness to selfless love of the other especially in the tough times when we are not our best selves.

Over the years I asked many of you how do you do it so consistently and so well. The response is always around the same, "I love them for who they are and not for what they do; I love them because they are mine to love and they love me back and I am theirs to love." The other thing people tell me is that the source of their love is God's love. That is beautiful and I truly believe it is the source of strength for most successful marriages. God's love for us.

It is a beautiful thing to witness and my parents were a great witness to me. But so too are all of you. You are truly amazing in the way you love each other through all the tough times.

Henri Nouwen says, "Self-knowledge and self-love are the fruit of knowing and loving God. You can see better then, what is intended by the great commandment to "love the Lord your God with all your heart, with all your soul, and with all your mind, and to love your neighbor as yourself." Laying our hearts totally open to God leads to a love of ourselves that enables us to give wholehearted love to our fellow human beings. LIVING THE LITURGY

Music Ministry: The Three Judgements

There are several aspects of the Eucharistic Liturgy that appeal directly to the way we as Catholics relate to the Word of God. The numerous prayers and antiphons provided for each mass by the wisdom of the Church relate directly to the readings, helping us to internalize



the message of the Liturgy of the Word. The Presider helps the Assembly to apply the message of the Gospel to our daily lives through the Homily and through the Presidential Prayers that are crucial to the Eucharistic Liturgy. Another aspect of the Liturgy that helps the gathered Faithful to internalize Christ's message is Music.

The singing of songs at mass is of crucial importance to our Sunday worship, and the selection of songs is a matter of great importance. When the Parish Staff here at Holy Spirit selects our music for mass, there is an evaluation process that takes place, mandated by the United States Council of Catholic Bishops. This process ensures that music selected for liturgy is musically sensible, consistent with the gospel message, appropriate for the different parts of mass, and, perhaps most importantly, relatable to the Assembly.

This evaluation process consists of three Judgements: The Liturgical Judgement, The Pastoral Judgement, and The Musical Judgement. The Liturgical Judgement ensures that the words we sing both agree with Catholic teaching and uplift the different parts of the Liturgy. The Pastoral Judgement takes into consideration what will help the gathered Assembly grow closer in relationship with God. And the Musical Judgement considers the style of music being used, and whether or not it matches the sacredness of the Rite being celebrated.

When all of these judgements are combined, the songs that come from it create a space for every member of the Assembly to worship in a way that strengthens our formation in faith, opens our hearts to the mystery of the Liturgy, relates to our everyday lives as Catholic Christians, and draws us nearer to Christ, which is the heart of our celebration.

July 6-13 Nicaragua Trip Registration Now Open Online registration for the July 6-13 Mission trip to Nicaragua is now open on the Holy Spirit website, http://holyspiritchurch.org/nicaragua-mission-trip. Registration will remain open until Feb. 27 or all 70



spots have been filled. The cost of the trip is \$1350 per person. A nonrefundable deposit of \$200 must be paid at the time of registration. Holy Spirit is planning this trip to Nicaragua following a one year hiatus. While political turmoil in the country last year forced most missionary groups – like Holy Spirit – to cancel trips last year, we anticipate groups returning this spring. Our partner organization in Nicaragua, Amigos for Christ, has missionaries starting this month. This year all missionaries will be required to travel together, and minors of high school age must be accompanied with a parent or legal guardian. The trip will accommodate up to 70 missionaries on its group flight on Avianca Airlines on a first come/first serve basis. 
