Turkey and Tarps Drive For Sacred Heart





The Thanksgiving and Christmas seasons are opportunities for us to celebrate the good gifts God has given us.

For many, the holiday season is a special time to serve the poor and to share our blessings with those who need it. We have an opportunity to do a small thing by providing a turkey for dinner or tarp for those in need.

Each year Sacred Heart Community Service provides groceries for a turkey dinner to over 10,000 people with the help of \$20 donations received from Holy Spirit parishioners. Last year we raised over \$10,500.

In the past 12 years the parish has generously raised over \$120,000.00 to support those in need at Sacred Heart. Also, last year we purchased over 1,000 tarps to support our neighbors who do not have adequate or available shelter from the cold and rain that the winter months bring.

We will be accepting donations after all masses the weekends of **November 2-3 and November 9-10.**

To help make this drive run smoothly we are asking for 3 volunteers to work after each mass on those weekends. Many hands make for a light workload.

NOTE FROM OUR PASTOR



Last weekend, I led a retreat at the Jesuit Retreat Center in Los Altos called "Hard Resetting Your Spiritual Lives." We had 26 retreatants of which 14 were from Holy Spirit Parish. Everyone in attendance gave me feedback that they enjoyed the retreat immensely and found it very help-ful for 'jumpstarting" their spiritual lives and getting back into the habit of prayer. For 50% of the attendees it was their first time experiencing a weekend retreat at the Jesuit Retreat Center and for the other 50% it was the first retreat ever. Most of retreatants suggested that I find some way to have more people from our parish experience this retreat. I chatted briefly with some of them as to why it has taken them so long to come away on retreat and what I might say to others to come away. The advice was varied and interesting.

The staff at JRC were pleased with the number of 26, but I started to think about how long it would take to get everyone in our parish to experience a retreat. Even if I was wildly successful with 50 attending each year it would still take me 20 more years to reach just 50% of our parishioners. I don't have 20 more years here at Holy Spirit Parish to effect that change!

So, I listened to my own advice and took it to the Lord in prayer over the weekend and then I listened to his ideas. The Lord said, "If you can't get them to come to the retreat house for the weekend, then take the retreat house to them!" At first, I did not understand but then I got it. The Lord wants us to convert the entire parish property into a "retreat center" for one weekend next year and have EVERYONE come away on retreat. **Here is the concept and I want to hear your feedback.**

We would ask everyone in the parish to attend the retreat held on parish property for the entire weekend and only go home to sleep. We would convert the entire property into a retreat center, making every classroom into a different themed place of prayer. All the sessions would take place in the Church and all the meals in the gym. We would serve breakfast, lunch and dinner every day. There would be places of silent prayer and places for conversation and dialogue. There would be a variety of resources available throughout the property all directed towards praying and learning how to master a deeper relationship with Christ. The retreat would start on Friday with Mass at 5pm followed by dinner and conclude with Mass on Sunday at 11:30am followed by lunch. There would be no Regular Sunday Masses available to the community on Sunday morning but only Sunday evening at 6pm and possibly addition Mass at 4pm if we believe we need an additional for non-retreatants parishioners to fulfill their Sunday obligation.

All Saints Souls Day

For more than a 1,000 years generations of Catholic Christians have held the tradition of remembering their dead with Special devotions throughout the month of November.

The universal church begins the month with the Feasts of All Saints on November 1 and All Souls on November 2 when we pause to honor the entire communion of saints and pray for the souls of those who have gone before us. Here within the Holy Spirit community, on the Feast of All Saints on November 1st, the singing bowl gong will toll at the Prayers of the Faithful for those in our community who have died during this year.

For the remainder of November, we will continue the tradition of the In Memorium Cards. These cards are available to record the names of those you wish to remember in death. We ask you to place these cards in the collection baskets during the offertory. The cards will be brought forward at each weekend liturgy during November and offered up during the Eucharistic Prayer. This is a strong symbol of solidarity with those who have died, and it will provide a more Visible way of praying for them at each Mass.

The month ends with our American celebration of Thanksgiving when we gather together to praise God for the harvest bounty and all he has bestowed upon us as a people and as a nation. On Thanksgiving Day, we celebrate Mass at 9:00AM and then share our traditional agape where every family brings bread to share.

During November, the church, our nation and nature remind us that we are part of a larger story, that we are connected, each to the other, with bonds so strong that not even death can destroy them. What beautiful traditions to celebrate our connections to the entire communion of saints!
