

Do I have zeal for the
Church and Her works?

NOTE FROM OUR PASTOR



Last year, I wrote in the bulletin about Dr. Phil, the TV therapist, who counsels couples in difficult situations. I quoted his signature question, "And how is that working for you?" when referring to someone who is clearly doing something that is not working.

It is a great question to ask ourselves again in our own personal lives especially for our Lenten journey. **Is what we have been doing in the past working for us and are we are getting the most out of our lives?** Often, we get stuck in doing the same thing over and over again and we wonder why we are in the same spot and feeling the same way. If we want to be in a different place, then we need to try something different. This applies in our personal lives as well as in our professional lives and maybe even more so in our spiritual lives.

Over the last year, we have offered many different opportunities to "learn how to pray". We have examined our spiritual lives for a moment and challenged each other to deepen our relationship with Jesus. It is with great excitement that many of our parishioners took us up on the challenge and over 100 people deepened their prayer lives in some major way. Some taking a 4-week session, others a 6-week session, still others a weekend retreat. Many took some of the scattering session to ease into some new way. All in all, there is continued commitment to growing our friendship with Jesus. I encourage you all to take some of the offerings coming up in the weeks ahead.

Most of us know our "prayers" and often do well to "say our prayers" each day. However, I believe we are called to a deeper relationship in our prayer than just saying prayers; we are called to listen to Christ. There is still an important place for "saying prayers" but we can learn to do more. Again, I remind us of the three stages to prayer. 1) Talking at God, 2) Talking with God and 3) Listening to God. Over the next few weeks I will be sharing techniques that I hope will help you grow in that relationship with Jesus.

I encourage you to share with me any successes or failures you have in praying and deepening your relationship with Christ as I can assure you that many others will appreciate your experience as they will not be in such a different spot.

It is my hope that together we will continue our Lenten journey and deepen our prayer lives by trying something new. **May we not settle for the way we have always done it. Let's try something new.** I promise you that the Lord wants us to be very happy. Come on this journey with us.



LIVING THE LITURGY



Introductory Rites

One of the most significant parts of any Catholic prayer is the way it begins: In the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. This statement, accompanied by the sign of the cross, is a testament of our faith as Catholics, and brings perspective to the prayer that follows it in that it is all done in the name of God. This beginning statement also calls us to focus in on the presence of God in our lives as we acknowledge Him in prayer. The Eucharistic Liturgy that we celebrate at Mass every Sunday is the most powerful prayer that we can pray, and the way that it begins is paramount to the power of the celebration. This beginning part of the prayer of the Mass is called the Introductory Rite.

The Introductory Rite has four parts: the Entrance, the Penitential Act, the Gloria, and the Collect. All four parts are important to setting the stage for our worship at Mass. It could be likened to the Overture and opening dialogue of a stage play; it sets the stage for the rest of Mass to take place. During the Entrance, the presider, accompanied by concelebrants and other liturgical ministers carrying the Book of the Gospels, the altar candles and the Processional Cross, make their way from the doors of the church to the sanctuary while the Gathering Song is sung. The Gathering song, which generally centers in theme around gathering God's people together, ends when the presider reaches the presider's chair, where he, along with the whole congregation, cross themselves in the name of the Father, of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. After a simple greeting, the community proceeds to prepare their hearts for the Word of God.

After the Gathering, the priest asks the gathered assembly to call to mind their sins, so that they can ask God's forgiveness as a community. This is called the Penitential Act. During this act, the church will often chant of say a Kyrie Eleison, which means, "Lord have mercy." Once the Kyrie ends, the assembly will sing the Gloria, giving glory to God for his sacrifice for humanity (except during Lent and Advent, in observance of the solemnity of seasons). After the Gloria, the presider will lead the assembly in an opening prayer, called the Collect, which serves as a transition from the Introductory Rite into the Liturgy of the Word.

In our interactions with God as Christians, it is important to embody a posture of prayer. This is what we do during the Introductory Rite: we gather and prepare ourselves for the mystery of our Faith in the Word and at the Altar.



Pastoral Care Ministry

Pastoral Care to the Sick and the Homebound is a ministry of compassion, a responsive desire to alleviate the suffering of another.


