Village House Shelter Opens January 3; Volunteers Needed Now!

Holy Spirit is still in need of volunteers when we host, Village House, the rotating shelter for homeless women. The Shelter offers a wonderful opportunity for parishioners to live out Christ's message of serving our homeless neighbors through love and compassion! Our evening shelter will operate from 7pm - 7am seven days per week, January 3 – February 3. Once again, the Episcopal Church of Almaden will operate a day center during the daytime hours.

Holy Spirit is in its 5th year of heading the Village House Network. Since 2016 the year-round Network has grown to 20 churches of shelters and day centers. The shelter has been home to over 100 women since 2016 helping to stabilize their lives. Now it's our opportunity to open our doors to the homeless. **We still have many openings – especially during our overnight shifts!**

Volunteer Opportunities at Holy Spirit:

- **Intake and registration** – Assist guests with registration and sign-in each evening.
- **Morning meals** – Prepared at home and served to our guests in the parish conference room.
- **Daily lunch** - Our guests make own lunches. Volunteers help organize and restock supplies.
- **Evening meals** – Prepared at home and served to our guests in the parish conference room.
- **Laundry** – Weekly laundry service for our guests; pick up laundry bags and launder at home. Clean sheets and towels are returned to the parish.
- **Overnight monitors** – Volunteers spend the night in the shelter assuring our guests have a safe and restful evening.
- **Overnight setup** – Each evening, we need volunteers to assist setting up sleeping cots in the church.
- **Transportation** – Each morning and evening, provide transport between Holy Spirit and the warming center or the VTA light rail. Volunteers provide their own vehicles to transport our guests.



Sign ups are open on the Holy Spirit website Village House webpage; <https://holyspiritchurch.org/village-house>. Screening is required by the Catholic Diocese of San Jose for those volunteers in close contact with our shelter guests.

NOTE FROM OUR PASTOR



When I was a really young child growing up inside a large family, I thought every household was just like mine. Not that I thought every family had 12 children, but I thought every family had loving parents who cared and provided food and shelter and abundant love. I had no reason to doubt this was a reality for every child. Then I discovered some exceptions in those around me, some of my friends, whose home lives were very ugly and broken. I did not judge but I was saddened for them and would often encourage them to hang out with my family more. Sometimes that helped, sometimes it made it worse! But I tried in any way I could to share my incredible blessings with others.

Today we celebrate the Feast of the Holy Family, Joseph, Mary and Jesus, the ultimate example of a loving family. It is apt to pause for a moment and be grateful to God for his gift of love inside our own family. No family is perfect but many of us have loving families that mirror, however imperfectly, the Holy Family and allow us to understand the love of God. This weekend, we ought to take some time to acknowledge and express the love we share inside our families, whether in our own immediate family or our larger extended family by saying thank you to those who are around us.



Some people find it hard to conceive of a loving family. Their experience has been painful and even thinking about it hurts. Most of them have managed to overcome that experience and live functional and successful lives. However, sometimes the dysfunction is too much and it has broken some people. Often, they go on to make even worse decisions compounding the situation. Sometimes it happens to them and sometimes it is caused by them and their bad choices.

No matter whether we have inherited loving families or managed to navigate the dysfunctions, there is an opportunity and maybe even an obligation to share our love with others. We do not come to judge others in this situation, but rather we do what we can to help them with love. That is the reason we started Village House, a shelter for 15 medically fragile women who are experiencing homelessness. Their lives have unraveled a little and they need someone to love them where they are at right now and help them piece their lives back together again.

Next week on January 3, we will open our doors to the Village House. We will shine the light of Christ into their darkened world. For the next 30 days, we will love them and show them the way of love. We need parishioners to help by signing up for different volunteer opportunities. Please go to the parish website and sign up for a spot. We need your help to help them.

Mary, the Mother of God

The title of Mary as the "Mother of God" was already being recognized from the Second century by early Church Fathers in their writings. They gave the honor of this title to Mary and it was widely accepted by the Christian believers. Then, it was challenged by Nestorius, Bishop of Constantinople, who refused to use the title, and said instead, that Mary should be called rather the "Mother of Christ". It became controversial when Nestorius barred the use of it. This controversy spread out not only in the Capitol city of Constantinople but also to other imperial cities. Cyril of Alexandria heard about the statement of Nestorius and appealed to him to recant his argument. Cyril claimed that if Mary did not bear God then neither was the Incarnate Word bore of her be called God; moreover, if the Scriptures named the Incarnate Word, God, how then should she who bore Him not be the Mother of God. The dispute about the title began not only between them but also with other early Church Fathers. As a result, the Council of Ephesus was convened in 431 A.D. by Emperor Theodosius II and later the council declared the title of Mary as the "Mother of God" a dogma.



This brings us to the question: What was the cause worth of defending this title of Mary? Our Church Fathers never claimed that Mary was a divine person. This was not their intention. The importance of the title was to protect the two natures of Jesus Christ, who is true God and who is true Man, together in one divine person (*prosopon*) and one hypostasis, without confusion, change, division, or separation. As Pope Emeritus Benedict XVI said, this title indeed highlights the fact that Jesus Christ is God and truly was born of Mary as a Man: in this way His unity as true God and true man is protected and preserved.

The Solemnity of Mary, the Holy Mother of God, is celebrated every January 1. It was Pope Paul VI who promulgated it, which was formerly celebrated on 11 October.

Holy Mary, Mother of God, pray for us sinners, now and at the hour of our death. Amen.



Our Goal is for all members of the Holy Spirit Parish Community to grow in a loving relationship with God through the person of Jesus. The "Growing our Friendship with Jesus" adult formation was developed to take everyone where they currently are in their faith journey and help them grow their relationship with Jesus.

The planting sessions will teach you various tools and practices to use in your daily prayer time. This process is for anyone looking to be more consistent and deliberate in their prayer life. The participants will be presented methods of creating sacred space for prayer, developing a routine, using scripture and other forms of prayer to enrich their prayer experience.

The Winter Plantings will launch with a half-day Retreat on **Sat., Jan. 11th from 9am to -12noon** at Holy Spirit Parish. This is the ideal way for you to get centered and focused before experiencing the 4 sessions.

The dates and topics for the Thursday 7pm-9pm weekly sessions are:

Jan. 16 – Lectio-Creating a Prayer Space

Jan. 23 – Imaginative Prayer

Jan. 30 – Visio/Time Management

Feb. 6 – Examen Prayer

The Winter Plantings will culminate with a closing half-day Retreat on **Sat., Feb. 15th from 9am to 12noon** at Holy Spirit Parish. This is the best way to put into practice all that you have learned and advance your closeness and communication with Jesus.
