Travel Requirements

- Passports
 - Must be valid for 6 months after trip
 - Applications should have been submitted already
- Highly Recommended Vaccinations/Medications
 - Tetanus booster if necessary
 - Hepatitis A and B
 - Malaria pills
 - Cipro
 - Travelmedicineclinic.net (Los Gatos)
- Fingerprints and Safe Environment Training
 - Adults need to be fingerprinted
 - Everyone needs Safe Environment Training
 - Katie Metzger to coordinate



Safety

- Safety is the #1 priority
- Travel groups
 - Travel days will be lead by travel leaders
 - Critical to follow instructions and stay together
- Stay on-property as much as possible
 - Youth not allowed off-property without a chaperone



Requirements

- Review and comply with the code of conduct
- Highlights
 - Adults must notify trip leadership if they need to leave the Amigos property or worksite
 - Minors cannot leave Amigos property or worksite without a parent
 - No purpling; opposite sex not allowed in the other's dorm for any reason
- Always follow instructions of trip leadership



Travel Logistics

- Meet at Holy Spirit at 8pm, Friday, 6th
 - Bus departs for SFO at 9pm sharp
- Divide up into travel groups
 - Stay with your group!
- SFO to San Salvador, San Salvador to Managua
- Bus ride to Las Peñitas; hang, eat
 - Bring change of clothes, towel, anything you need for the day
- Bus ride to Chinandega in the evening

 - AV561 departure from SFO at 1:30am July 14th
 - TA396 arrival in MGA at 9:35am July 14th
- From Nica
 - TA397 departure from MGA at 5:30pm July 21st

Accommodations

- Gated Compound
- Men's and Women's dormitories
 - Bunk beds in a big open space
- Separate rooms available for married couples
- Dining hall for meals
- Rancho for gatherings



Meals

- Breakfast
 - At the compound
 - Cereal, eggs, gallopinto, fruit, yogurt
- Lunch
 - At the worksite
 - PB&J
- Dinner
 - At the compound
 - Assorted dishes, always with gallopinto 😊
- If you have dietary restrictions, see me



Weather

- Tropical: hot and humid
- High 80's, low 90's during the day
- High 70's at night
- 90% humidity
- Rain likely

- I hacked it off with a safety razor because it was so stinking hot 😊
- One of the rare times anyone has seen me clean-shaven

Water

- Being properly hydrated is critical to staying healthy
 - Prepare to drink tons of water while there
 - Bring a refillable water bottle of at least 32 oz with you to use all week (e.g. hydroflask of similar)
- You MUST NOT arrive in Nica dehydrated
- Get hydrated before the trip
 - A few weeks before departure, start drinking extra water
 - Target half your body weight in ounces per day
 - Example: If you weight 120 lbs, drink 60 oz per day (more if you are physically active)
- Take this seriously!
 - People's entire trips have been ruined by dehydration



A Typical Week

- Saturday → Vijil beach house in Las Peñitas
- Sunday → Climb a volcano
- Monday, Tuesday → Community work
- Wednesday → Special activity
- Thursday, Friday → Community work
- Saturday → Travel home
- Devotional and small group discussions morning and evening



Service Opportunities

- To paraphrase John Bland:
“The work will always get done. It’s the human contact and the relationships that are the most important.”
- Digging and/or construction

 - Working with children at the school, art projects, etc.
- Medical for those with medical training
