Before I left for Tahoe, I had an opportunity to visit the VBS at our own parish and experience the endless energy of the "little ones" while they learned about Jesus as the "center of their universe." Merry, Annie and the entire team of leaders did an amazing job of engaging these little ones in developing their faith. I am very grateful for the tons of volunteers who gave of their whole week to allow our children to frolic in the hot week and learn of Jesus in creative ways.

And this is just the first week of summer!! Wow! What a great start! I pray that every one of our children can get to discover the love of God through such lively programs and I pray they grow in their faith. May we be renewed by their enthusiasm and recommit to sharing our faith with them.

LIVING THE LITURGY



Pentecost

Last week was the feast of Pentecost which commemorates the outpouring of the Holy Spirit on the disciples gathered in the "upper room."

Traditionally, this feast was celebrated on a Thursday 50 days after Easter but in recent times it has been left to the local Bishop to transfer the Feast to the seventh Sunday after Easter. It was also the feast day of our parish. The red sanctuary colors symbolize the fire of the Holy Spirit as well as the commission from God to proclaim and to spread the good news of the Gospel to all nations. It is this work of the Holy Spirit that ultimately fulfills the mission of Christ. This outpouring of the Holy Spirit is represented by Seven gifts: Courage, Understanding, Piety, Wisdom, Awe or Wonder, Counsel or Right Judgment, and Knowledge. The biblical origin of these seven gifts is found in Isaiah 11:1-3 where the qualities of the Messiah are foretold. These seven gifts are the signs that the Messiah will be guided by the Spirit.

Indeed, Jesus, at His baptism, was filled with the Holy Spirit. And throughout the Gospels, we read how these seven gifts formed Jesus' persona, i.e. His courage to continue His journey to Jerusalem despite the prophesied danger; His understanding of the poor and the sick; His reverence for His Heavenly Father; the wisdom expressed in His parables; His awe before the wonders of creation; His right judgment when tested by the Pharisees; and His knowledge of God's will.

Pentecost Sunday is a day to celebrate hope, a hope evoked by the knowledge that God, through the Holy Spirit, is at work among His people. It is a celebration of newness, regeneration, renewal of purpose, mission, and calling. It is a recognition that His work is done through His people as He pours out His presence upon them. Though this grace, we must renew our commitment to serve our community and continue God's work in the world.

PASTORAL CARE



Summer Heat and Caregiving,

The dog days of summer can complicate caregiving. Seniors and vulnerable adults with medical challenges, cognitive diseases, dementia or Alzheimer's, are sensitive to temperature extremes-- high summer temps or overly-air conditioned rooms. The result presents as low motivation, appetite and activity levels. Here are some ways to keep up with your loved one's needs this summer:

Use mobile health care. During milder weather, getting out of the house for appointments provides stimulation and social interaction. But in the sizzling summer months, take advantage of home health practitioners who make house calls, mobile labs and other services. Postpone non-essential appointments.

Bring in friends, services & exercise. Invite friends over for meals or short visits, so both care receiver and caregiver have opportunities to socialize with others.

Watch fluid intake. Even with staying inside, increased fluids are still necessary. Seniors often don't feel thirsty, so remind your loved one to sip water. Insulated cups ensures drinks stay cooler and straws seem to encourage more drinking. *(Adapted from AARP by Amy Goyer, 2014.)*
